AICUF as its motto says always aims for marching with the marginalised. The club activities always point towards including the excluded and raising the voice against the injustices and evils of the society. This year was no different for the students of Loyola College, where through AICUF, the students not only realised the excluding trend of the society but also the grief and the pain of the excluded and the need to provide them with the possible support. Various programmes were organised aiming to provide a wealthy experience for the young blood to understand the suffering of the poor and to fight for them.

The programmes for the year started with the official inauguration of the club activities for the year, where the students who were new to the AICUF movement was introduced with the aim of the activities, their duties towards the society through the club, what was expected from them etc. An outline of the programmes to be conducted was presented and the students were encouraged to participate with their heart and soul for all the programmes to be conducted.

The other programmes for the year included a walkathon conducted for spreading the message of creating a peaceful society. A training session was conducted on STREET PLAY for all the AICUFers of Loyola College.
