II. Programme Title: Hands on training on Horticulture and Vegetable Gardening

Practical skills in agriculture and horticulture, gardens are a living laboratory for the study of environmental issues and life sciences. The aim of this programme was to expose students of ENACTUS Shift II was to provide a model of a mixed kitchen garden for the community. Horticulture Kit was obtained from TN Horticulture centre, Madhavaram with the following components:

- Polythene grow bags with 2Kg Coco peat / bag
- Polythene spreading sheet,4×4mt (400gsm)
- Water soluble fertilizer
- Bio fertilizers
- Bio pesticide
- Bio fungicides
- Vegetable seed kit(10 kinds)

Forty one students from ENACTUS Shift II in two sessions were involved in cleaning and mending the rugged land in the community centre and transformed it into a plough-able vegetable garden.

The training programme was conducted on the issue relating to the import and export of the traditional herbs as well as, medicinal plants, including its impact on the global and domestic trade activities. Self Help Group women from the urban slums of Chennai were sensitized towards the probabilities of women empowerment through participation in exporting and importing of low cost herbal plants, they were also educated about the guidelines considering horticulture requirements, harvesting, methods of drying and packaging of herbal plants. Out of the 880 plants which could be exported, the trainer Mr. Balachandran, elaborated the medicinal significance and export pricing of 15 plants by live demonstration. Mr. Vijay Suresh, Aloevera India Pvt Ltd., who was one among the invited resource persons, explained the significance of quality assurance of medicinal plants to ensure purity, safety, security in meeting global standards. The programme came to an end, with the feedback session from the community women and students of the club. As a mark of success of the training programme, 25 women and 3 student members came forward to register their names under Makkal Impo and Expo and gave their consensus to participate in exportation of medicinal plants.

Bag making is a very profitable venture as it requires cheap and minimum raw materials to make a paper or an aster bag. Newspapers, chart paper and fancy decorative paper were used to make paper bags for different purposes. Trainer from Smart Skills Fashion Technology, Vadapalani Chennai were invited to train 50 college students and 50 participants from the urban slum community. The bags the participants made were strong and can be used to carry grocey and vegetables. All the raw material is quite inexpensive since it is easily available in homes.

Nutrition education programme is one of the most power tool to eradicate hunger and poverty, Loyola ENACTUS students decided to educate the community women on aspect of nutrition security to equip them to fight against poverty by teaching a skill on fruit and vegetable preservation. Fruits and vegetables are the main sources of vitamins and minerals in one's diet. Fruits and vegetables being perishable needs preservation. A one-day training programme on Fruits and vegetables preservation in urban slum areas was held in Chennai. Participants were thought to prepare fruit juices, jams and squashes and ways of preserving them in a home scale for a longer shelf-life.
