Characteristics of Jesuit Education


The report I am presenting before you, dear friends, has the dimensions mentioned in the characteristics of Jesuit Education. The New academic year 2011-12 began on 15th June 2011 to all our students; but for the newly recruited faculty members of our college on 6th June itself with a week-long Orientation programme on Jesuit Higher Education and the ethos of Loyola College!

THRUST AREAS OF THE COLLEGE:

The College has taken mentoring, remedial, restructuring and placement more seriously during this academic year. Mentoring has been strengthened through training of teachers keeping in mind the first generation students and the students from the marginalized sections of the society. A clear-cut instruction has been given to all our staff members to make this mentoring programme very effective and useful to the student community particularly for the students of first generation. The college has laid more stress on remedial/tutorial. The students who are weak in English were identified and given regular coaching in English. The departments were involved in conducting the remedial programme for the academically weaker students. The college has constituted a restructuring committee and they are revisiting teaching, learning and evaluation programmes of the departments. From next year onwards we are going to implement the restructured curriculum to all our students. This year the placement of students was done very methodically and effectively and I am very happy to announce that we have placed 90% of the students who have registered with the placement office for jobs in reputed companies and organizations.

ACHIEVEMENTS & HIGHLIGHTS:

- TM We are happy to announce the creation of **RITU AND SANJAY KAURA CHAIR IN LIBERAL ARTS** instituted by

 M/S RITU AND SANJAY KAURA in memory of **SHRI. SATISH KAURA**, an illustrious alumnus of our College. This

 Chair, first of its kind in a college, would enable us to
 appoint a scholar of international repute to promote interdisciplinary research across arts disciplines in our college.
- The UGC Experts Committee visited the college on 17-18th

 December 2011 for extending the period of autonomy from 2011-12 to 2016-17. Their recommendation to the UGC is the following. "The Committee was unanimously of the view that institutions like the Loyola College, Chennai which have performed well as an autonomous institution and which have undergone 3-4 reviews for the last 30 years by the UGC periodically, need not be reviewed an infinitum by the same set of norms as meant for fresh institution. Either they could be given a permanent autonomous status or preferentially a new set of criteria may be evolved by the UGC for the review of such institution which expects them to perform as pace setting institution of academic excellence".

- (arts, science and commerce) in the **INDIA TODAY 2011 RANKING** (Arts 3rd Place, Science 2nd Place, Commerce 3rd Place). This is the only college which has been listed in all the three streams.
- TM Loyola stood as one of the top ten colleges in all the streams (ar ts, science and commerce) in the WEEKLY 2011 RANKING.
- Under the "COLLEGE WITH POTENTIAL FOR EXCELLENCE"

 CPE (phase II) scheme, UGC has sanctioned Rs. 75, 00,000 /- (75 lakhs) and released Rs. 37,50,000 /- (Rupees thirty seven lakhs and fifty thousand) as first installment. The first installment had been utilized for improving employability skills for students, purchase of equipments for enhancing teaching, to introduce reforms in evaluation / examinations and for institutional quality enhancement.
- NAAC Reaccreditation Process: A team, consisting of Principal, Secretary, IQAC Coordinator, members of the IQAC and a staff member from each department, worked on the department profile and evaluative report (descriptive) of the departments. Towards the end of last academic year 2010-11, the college submitted the Letter of Intent (LOI) on 16th April 2011 to the NAAC. The Self-Study Report (SSR) was finalized after several rounds of sitting with stakeholders. The college submitted the SSR on 17th October 2011 exactly the day when it was due for submission.
- Restructuring Of Curriculum: The College is heading towards restructuring of curriculum effective from the academic year 2012-13. The restructuring committee held wide consultations at various levels. The restructuring process is nearing completion for PG and UG. The whole process is done in a transparent manner by taking in to confidence all the HODs, officials, college management and the faculty. The highlights are:

- 7. Introduction of a self study paper for interested UG /PG students
 - 8. Strengthening of internship for UG students
 - 9. Innovations in teaching, learning and evaluation
- 10. Question Bank for all the subjects in all disciplines both for UG and PG programmes.
- TM UGC office: Separate office to deal with UGC and other funding agencies has been set up with one full time nonteaching staff working in that office. Dean of Research takes charge of UGC office. This office with the help of Bursar's office got the Utilization certificates from the Professors who got money from UGC and CSIR for conducting conferences since 1999.
- TM First time Loyola conducted 10 day bridge course for the students of I years. Department of English prepared the syllabus. The students seemed to have benefitted from this.
- Patel Foundation provided scholarships to cover the College fees and the Hostel fees to all the visually challenged students admitted this year. It also provided grant to buy sports equipments and musical instruments to conduct sports and to teach music to the visually challenged students and sponsored 10 laptops to the visually challenged persons.

NEW COURSE

The long felt dream of upgrading the department of the Tamil came true with the starting of a Post Graduate Course in Tamil Literature during this academic year. First year M.A. Tamil course was started from this academic year.

THE NEW FACES

Three (3) teachers joined departments during this academic year in Shift-I and thirteen(13) joined shift-II departments.

ADMISSION

The total number of students admitted in the UG programme (both in Shift I and II) stood at 2104 and the PG programme (both in Shift I and II) stood at 620. 98 students have been admitted in M.Phil. More than 42% of the students admitted, belong to the marginalized communities (SC/ST, MBC and DNC).

RESULTS:

In view of the unsatisfactory pass-percentage of UG arts and science- being 74 and 62 percent, respectively the college has taken the remedial and tutorial programme more seriously. English coaching is given separately and the subjects are handled by the departments. This is one of the major concerns of the college. The other results are satisfactory, UG commerce pass percentage stood at 80%, PG Arts 90%, PG Commerce 82%, PG Science 90% and the pass percentage in M.Phil. stood at 81%.

INFRASTRUCTURE:

- In July 2011, our College received UGC grant of Rs.48,00,000/- (48 lakhs) for the construction of Women's hostel in the campus. A total sum of Rs.1,08,00,000 /-(Rupees One crore and eight lakhs) had been released so far by UGC for this purpose, and we are trying to get a balance amount of Rs.12,00,000 /-(Rupees Twelve lakhs) from UGC. This academic year saw Girls joining the hostel and it was dream coming true for Loyola girls.
- By effectively utilizing the funds received from UGC under various schemes like UGC-BSR, UGC (additional grant) and UGC-CPE, the total number SMART ROOMS in our college has gone up to 14. Almost all the Departments under aided stream have been equipped with SMART ROOM facility.

MENTORING PROGRAMME:

Like last year, students of the first year went on for choosing the mentor online on 21st July 2011 and the number of students who chose the mentors was more than last year. The departments assigned mentors to those students who did not choose the mentors through online. There were two organized sessions of mentoring during this academic year. First mentoring session took place between 25th to 27th July 2011 and the second mentoring sessions were conducted between January 8 and 11, 2012.

Guidelines were prepared by the Vice-principal for each class taking into consideration their academic needs and the same was given to all the teachers. Many students were able to meet the mentors outside the structured mentoring schedule and benefited from the session.

REMEDIAL PROGRAMME:

SPECIAL ENGLISH COACHING CLASSES: LEADS organizes every year Special English coaching classes for the C-stream and the first generation students. 450 students benefited from this programme. Seven teaching staff from the Department of English conducted the course.

REMEDIAL CLASSES: Remedial coaching and Intensive tutorial classes are conducted every year for the arrear students.



This year approximately 300 students benefited from this programme. Twenty-five staff from shift-I & Shift-II had handled these classes. Intensive tutorial classes also were organized for all the arrear students with an average of 20 hours per subjects

GRADUATION DAY:

The 84th Graduation day was held on 28th January 2012. The Union Minister for Shipping Government of India, **Shri G.K. Vasan** delivered the Graduation day address and distributed diplomas to 1538 candidates. Out of this 63 received gold medals and 22 of them are differently abled students. In this academic year, the award of diploma to M.Phil. students also have been included first time at the graduation day.

FACULTY ENHANCEMENT PROGRAMMES:

The academic year started with the Junior Staff Orientation Programme (6th June to 10th June 2011) and followed by a General Staff Orientation Programme (June 13th & 14th, 2011) for two days. The junior staff underwent an Orientation Programme on Testing and Evaluation Methods for our Junior Staff on 3rd August 2011. There was a demonstration on 'smart class room' and many staff members benefited by the demo on different brands of smart white board. The COE (Controller of Examinations) and the IQAC had organized a one day workshop on 'Question Bank' as part of Testing and Evaluation Methods – Dr. Pon Subbiah, former director of the National Testing Centre, Mysore.

FUTURE DIRECTIONS

- 1. Realising the Loyola Master Plan (LMP): The Loyola Master Plan is being realized steadily. In building itself for its future, Loyola has paid its attention to effective management of human resources and financial management. The Master Plan has clearly delineated different strategies for quality education. Among them, this year we will focus on a) developing capability of our faculty to make them competent teachers; building a Poor Boys Fund to financially assist students from the poor, the marginalized, rural areas and the first generation learners.
- 2. Faculty Development: We will be organizing seminars, workshops and training programmes on competence building communication skills, teaching methodology, and mentoring. The Staff Development cell has been set now officially and it is organising different programmes in collaboration with IQAC.
- 3. Human Resources Management: This year a study of the state of HR of the college will be done in order that we could relieve or retrain incompetent staff, retain competent staff, and recruit needed competent staff. The study should help us also to a great extent to reorganize the ways we manage the human resources in the college.
- 4. School of Social Sciences: After having established the school of computing sciences, we have now the task of establishing a school of social sciences. A journal is getting ready to be launched. In the coming year, efforts would be made to stimulate research interest in social sciences as we have demonstrated in life, physical and chemical sciences.

5. Chair on Liberal Arts: One of our Alumni, Mr. Kaura and his family has funded for setting up a Chair on Liberal Arts. Once the fund is received into our account we will advertise to appoint a scholar and build office facilities for the Chair.

Fund is already received and process has begun

- 6. Reorganizing the Financial System: Recently we made a study under the leadership of Fr Casimir raj on the ways we manage finance in the college. Based on the report given by the committee we have gone for a ERP system. All the units have now been given demo about the software. From the end of March onwards we will use the system that would assist and monitor the ways we use and manage our finance.
- 7. **Infrastructure**: We must continue to build the infrastructure.
 - a. **School of Commerce:** the construction of the building will resume once we get deviations in the building plan cleared from the CMDA. The Alumni Association, under the leadership of Fr Casimir Raj, is mobilizing funds for the project.
 - b. Canteen & Food Court: The present canteen building is in dilapidated state. It does not have the capacity to accommodate the strength we have now. Therefore, the whole building needs to be demolished and rebuilt as a Food Court that accommodates all stalls and provides seating facility.
 - c. **Toilets**: The toilet behind the administrative building has to be shifted to further down to the open space towards the end of the compound. Similarly, the toilet near the canteen has to be shifted to some other place.
 - d. **Flooring Main Building:** It needs immediate attention. As the present financial status is not sound to divert to this work, we need to raise funds for such works. We are looking for sponsors to do this in this May
 - e. Repair of the Ceiling in Bertram Hall: we are looking for sponsors to replace the ceiling with a better false roof. This May this will be one of the works that will be done.
 - f. Refurnishing College Office and the Bursar Office: the college has seen huge growth and it has multiplied works in the main office. This demands space reorganization and modernization of the system and facilities.



- g. **Electricity:** the recent power shortage has resulted in excess expenses on diesel. And we need to replace the Genset that burnt down with a Genset that can provide power to all the buildings, especially the labs, in the time of electricity shut down, we need to have another generator. This has been added in this year budget.
- funds. The new brochure has been sent to more thousand alumni requesting them to fund our projects and assist our future plans. LDO is playing a key role in this. We must stimulate more effective work on this. Very specially, we aim at building up a Poor Boys Fund from which concessions and financial assistance to the poor students would be given. In the coming year, 2012-2013, this will receive major attention. Both Alumni and LDO would make efforts to realize the Master Plan. As always, the Lord who has been assisting us so far would continue to lead us in His ways to make Loyola a place of quality education that is accessed by the poor and the marginalized.

COLLEGE DAY

Respected Chief Guest Padma Shri. Dr. A. Sivadhanu Pillai, Fr. Amal, Rector, Fr. Joe Arun, Secretary, Fr. Jeyeraj, Principal, Fr. Arockiasamy, Dy. Principal, other dignitaries on the dais, teachers, alumni, students, parents and my dear brothers and sisters.

I bring to you warm greetings not only from myself but also from my colleagues at Dr. Mohan's Diabetes Specialty Centre and the Madras Diabetes Research Foundation.

As I sat here listening to the presentation of your Principal, on the achievements of Loyola College, I was filled with nostalgia because it was about 41 years ago that I stood here and cheered to hear at the Loyola College achievements at that time. But even at that time, I remember that it was a pride that I studied in this College and I wish to recollect some of those memories today, mainly to encourage and stimulate youngsters like you who are sitting in the audience today hoping that 40 years later you will be able to come back and make a speech like me, because it is inspiration that we got while we were in Loyola College which has taken us so far in life. So you may ask me: what did Loyola give you ? Loyola gave me almost everything and let me share a story with you briefly and you will realize that I am not saying this just because I am here for this occasion. Loyola had great teachers, Loyola taught me character, Loyola taught me morals, Loyola taught me discipline, it is the most disciplined College at that time and I think it still remains one of the most disciplined colleges.

My class of 1970 – 71, the Pre-University class was the best class ever I have had in my life. It is said from the bottom of my heart, because sitting in that one section of mine, I was in the Science Section and there were twenty two State rank holders. I don't think you can expect that in any College at this time. If you are a boy and a State rank holder you didn't have any other choice in Tamil Nadu but to come to Loyola College and that was our dream to get into Loyola College. The peer pressure that we learnt here, the healthy competition that we learnt here, I think has stood me in good stead throughout my life. But amongst all my teachers - Prof. Wilson is still alive and there are many other teachers of Loyola College to whom I owe my debt of gratitude, but one in particular became a very close friend of mine and if I may say he became my guru and I refer to none other than Prof. V A Murthy. Prof. Murthy was a gem of a human being, a kind of home I have not seen in my life and why do I say that it was Prof. Murthy and Loyola College who made me a doctor and made me what I am today. The Pre-University courses called one year but technically eight to nine months and during that 8-9 months your whole life is made. So I either made it in the merit or didn't make it. That's it. I don't think I would even have that money to pay to go to another private college today. During that time of Pre-University I developed several illnesses, first was jaundice which took

away a whole month of my postings at Loyola. I just came back for two days and then developed chicken pox and was out for another 2-3 weeks. And then I came back again and got malaria and was down for another couple of weeks and almost two and a half months of those eight to nine months in Loyola College for Pre-University which decides your career and I was at home in bed. So I gave up and I said that I was not even going to take the exam because there was no way and twenty two State rank holders in the class there was absolutely there was no way that I was going to take examination and this all happened not in the beginning of the course but almost towards the end. The whole of December went and January went and in March I had to take the exam. At that time when I joined back into the class and I did not know Prof. Murthy at all except as one of you sitting here and he is a teacher and I had no private interaction with him at that time. When I came for the first day back, I was still thin as you can see and after three major illness I was almost a walking skeleton. I was just coming into the class and Prof. Murthy called me and said 'meet me after the class'. When I met him he asked me what was wrong with me. You were missing for almost two months, what happened to you. Then I broke down and I said, "Sir, I am finished, my career is finished everything is finished all my hopes are gone. And he said "No. Don't give up" and this is what I am trying to tell the young students. Never give up, there is still hope. He said, "Are you ready to sacrifice your lunch for the next one and a half month. If you are willing to sacrifice your lunch for one and a half month I will teach you during that lunch hour and I will make you come up to the rest of the class. And I said, "I will do it for the whole year if you want. I am ready to sacrifice anything. Getting into medicine is my only goal and please help me." For the next one and a half month every single day during lunch hour Prof. Murthy would coach me in Zoology, got Prof. Wilson to teach me . And with that ladies and gentlemen to cut a very long story short I not only passed the exam, I not only got into medicine but I stood 1st in the Madras University. So from a life of almost complete impossibility something I



thought would never happen, he took me to the greatest heights and I stood first in the University and was admitted into not one or two but in three medical colleges. I got into Madras Medical College, I got into St. John's Medical College and I got into GIPMER and I had a choice of three medical colleges. So this was the starting point of a relationship with Prof. Murthy and through him later on to the entire zoology department.

So my advise to you as students would be 'never give up'. There's always hope and that is one of the important messages that I want to give you. Of course you need God's grace which will come if you put in all your effort. The other thing I would like to tell you is, don't just become a book worm. Of course you need to concentrate on studies, your focus should be on studies, that's the primary reason for which you have come here. Looking at the speech that Fr. Principal gave just now, if you look at the range of activities that you have, there is no excuse that this college doesn't offer you an opportunity to broaden your vision to develop your skills. Be it in sports be it in athletics, I was a champion short putter even in school and even in Loyola College. I was part of your athletic team. I played cricket here. I played tennis here. All that I have done during all these illnesses and so on. So where there is a will there is a way.

Today's people find it difficult to give a speech, to stand up and give a talk, to write effectively because all the courses and all the teaching that's going on, with India becoming super power and so on, our youngsters are not able to communicate and if you are not able to communicate you will not make it in life. Just coming first in the University, or getting into a course and so on will not make you a success in life. Some of the most successful people that we had in

Medical College who have won a lot of medals are nothing today in life. After that they disappeared, because they have just been mugging from the book and vomiting it out in the exam and that's not going to take you very far. It might take you through the examination, but in the examination of life, you need to speak, you need to think, you need to be creative and when Fr. Principal mentioned the principles of Jesuit education I think all of them are here and therefore I would say you are extremely lucky to be in an Institution like this. Make full use of it. Look up and aim high even the sky is not the limit.

A few days ago when Sachin Tendulkar was interviewed after he got his hundredth hundred, he was asked what was it Sachin that makes him go on and on others have all fallen along the way and he seemed to go on and on. And he said the very word I thought he would say, it is already mentioned here and earlier part of this meeting today the word passion. Passion is the word. As long as you have passion in you as long as you have in the belly that passion nobody can stop you. And the sky is the limit, you can keep going higher and higher. In fact after he got his hundredth hundred, they asked him, "Now, are you going to retire?". He said, "No I am still not ready to retire because my passion is still there. My body tells me that I can still do more for this country and therefore I will continue."

Of course you should have faith in God and all along we have been hearing the essence of religion or essence of faith in God: surrender to the will of God. In the Bible it is said:

Our Father who art in Heaven hallowed by Thy name,

Thy Kingdom come, Thy will be done"

So we are straight away saying that I am surrendering to Your will and every morning I think of this prayer which I learnt. And I think it is one of the most powerful prayers which everybody should say because Jesus himself has personally taught his disciples to say this prayer. At the same time there is no success without hard work. If you say God will take care of everything and I don't need to do anything you will be a total failure in life. Because only when you work hard the will of God and his blessings will come . Thomas Alva Edison said: 1% inspiration and 99% perspiration. So without that 99% perspiration you are not going to make it in life.

The heights of great men reached and kept, you may go there but you still have to maintain it like Sachin Tendulkar. So the heights of great men reached and kept were not attained by sudden flight. Dr. Sivadhanu Pillai is the head of DRDO, people will think he just landed there. They took him in a plane and put him on top of his position. If you see his life, you will see how hard he had to struggle. Behind every success there would have been years of hard work which he put in. So the heights reached and kept were not attained by sudden flight but they while their companion slept, toiled upwards in the night. That's how they got there and that's how they remained there.

All the struggle that you are doing is to look beyond and to look beyond. And that is the second message that I wanted to tell you today. Don't sweat the small stuff. Too much of our time in life, our life is very short. It may look very long for you. But let me tell you that this 40 years have rolled by very fast. Just look like the other day when I was in Loyola College, and 40 years of my life have gone and I am coming back to you again and time goes very fast. During the limited time that you are here on this earth, let us not spend time on trivialities. Let us not spend time in fighting with each other. There is no time for it. Conserve your energy for something bigger. Conserve your energy and that will take you forward. Because if you sweat the small stuff, if you focus on a small print you will miss the big picture. If I focus on the one little chair I miss Bertram Hall and all its grandeur. And therefore see the wide picture, forget the small things. And therefore in life develop that big picture; that big vision and once you do that you find that you are already at a higher level, on a higher plane. You are working constantly to improve yourself and raise the bar higher and higher. If I may be allowed five minutes, I may like to share with you four success stories.

Abebe Bikila was the Ethiopian runner who made history because he won the marathon at the Rome Olympics in 1960. That's not great by itself although he is the first Olympic gold medalist from Ethiopia. That is great by itself from a country where people are starving, this man for the first time a black man comes and wins a marathon in 1960 Rome Olympics. Now that was not enough. Just before the Rome Olympics he was always walking bare foot because he had no money for shoes. So he finally had to run the marathon barefoot.



He was the only one in the whole marathon who ran barefoot and then he wins a gold medal and after he finishes the lap at the Rome Olympics people asked him how he ran barefoot. "Doesn't it pain you?" and then he lifts his leg and shows the big hole in his leg. With that hole in his leg he not only ran the marathon but he also won the marathon and he ran it barefoot. Four years later he comes back. This time he had a shoe. Somebody had given him a shoe and finally he has a shoe. He comes back to the 64th Olympics in Tokyo, wins it again and this time he wins it with such a huge margin. He enters the stadium and other competitors were far behind and he runs two or three extra rounds. People ask him how he did all that. First of all they asked why did he run barefoot in Rome and he said that he wanted the world to know that his country Ethiopia has always won with determination and heroism. He used the word determination and heroism. And then again he won the gold medal and when he was asked if he was not feeling tired. He said, "I can go for another 10 kms if I want because I have the passion in me. The story didn't even end there. He came back again. He was too old by that time. He broke his leg while he was running and then after that he was donated a car. He got into an accident and became quadriplegic which means that his hands are gone his legs are gone and is bed ridden. He can't even sit in his wheel chair. It took him two years for the hands to become alright and the legs were still paraplegic and for life he was paraplegic. He sat in a wheel chair and in that wheel chair took part in the archery competition. He became a world archery champion. These are heights to which an ordinary unknown Ethiopian person, nobody even knew his name, somebody could not even pronounce his name can reach. But that is a human spirit. The second story I wantto tell you. A much shorter story about Lans Armstrong. He at the age of twenty five wanted to be world cycling champion. And at the age of twenty five he was diagnosed to have testicular cancer it has spread to his brains. People gave him three months and at the end of three months he would die. Lans Armstrong said, "Nothing doing, I will undergo all my treatment and he did all his chemotherapy and so on and then took up cycling as a major championship and seven years in a row he won that tour de France considered the highest ever cycling championship in the world. Nobody in

the history of humanity has ever won the Tour de France seven times and he did it all after his treatment for cancer.

The third is Garry Hall. Garry Hall's father was an Olympic gold medalist. His uncle was a gold medalist. Everybody in his family is some Olympic medalist and Garry Hall came at the age of twenty one. He took part in the first Olympic games and that time he didn't win the Olympic gold medal he won only the silver medal. Just after that he said, I'll come back for the Sydney Olympics in 2000 and let me try for a gold medal there. One year before the Sydney Olympics he developed insulin dependent diabetics and had to take several injections of insulin. So people wrote him off and said, "You can never take part in competitive spirit. He came back to the Sydney Olympics and this time won gold medal in everything, where he had got silver medals. He came back again and at the next Olympic games four year later he won another two gold medals there.

Wasim Akram is a very close friend of mine now. I go to his house and he comes to my house. He at the peak of his career, when he had already got two hundred and fifty wickets developed diabetics. He was admitted in hospital, and took several shots of insulin. He even carries insulin pen when he goes out for a dinner. He will have it on his table and he'll say there's nothing to be afraid about. During dinner he will take his own insulin shot. That man, half his career was after he got diabetics and not before. So these are all true stories to tell you if you think that something is possible it is possible. On a last note, I would like to quote my own guru and master Bhagwan Sri Sathya Sai Baba. Baba said and I quote: when there is righteousness in the heart, there is beauty in character, when there is beauty in character there is harmony in the home, when there is harmony in the home there is order in the nation, when there is order in the nation there in peace in the world. So everything starts with righteousness in the heart. That's what Loyola College is teaching you. If you are a righteous person, if you believe in righteousness, I think that is the secret for world peace.

Forty years earlier when I studied in Loyola College I was full of hopes, full of dreams and I must say that all those dreams came true. In fact that is one secret which I'd like to share with you. I'd like each and everyone one of you sitting here today, to believe in what I am telling you. This is the magic of believing. Go home today and before you go to bed take a piece of paper and write down ten things that you want to achieve in your life. Write down just one, two, three, four and five, ten things and prioritise them. If I wanted ten things in my life this is what I'd do. If you write down that list, if you make that list and make that list of ten and if you believe in it and if you focus on it then the whole of nature will conjure to make it happen. I made ten things like that when I was a student in Loyola College. And I can tell you that I have ticked off all the ten. All the ten have happened. I remember Wordsworth's word, in the poem The Daffodils

I gazed - and gazed- but little thought
What wealth the show to me had
brought: For oft, when on my couch I lie
In vacant or in pensive mood,
They flash upon that inward eye
Which is the bliss of solitude;
And then my heart with pleasure
fills, And dances with the daffodils.



CHIEF GUEST'S ADDRESS

PADMA SHRI Dr.A. SIVATHANU PILLAI



My greetings to all of you. I am indeed honored to participate in the 87th College Day Celebrations at this magnificent Bertram Hall. I feel proud to be in the prestigious campus of Loyola College which I was dreaming to come for several years which has started its education service in the year 1925. This premier institution provides students with the best quality knowledge and pass a niche in the value based education system so that the trained young men and women will be of quality leaders in all walks of life. Many eminent personalities are the alumni of the Institute.

Former President Venkatraman, Architect of India's operation flood Dr. Varghese Kurian, great economist Rangarajan, Journalist Ram all belong to this college. The list goes on. Some more names are going to be printed in our speeches from the people who are sitting here as students. Loyola College has taught us love. And also it is an Institution recognized as a Scientific and Industrial Research Organisation called SIRO. The Institution takes multi disciplinary research activities and the type of research which they are doing which I happened to discuss is of great importance and published in magazines and journals like "Nature" which is a very well renowned journal of the world. Experience of research leads to quality teaching and quality teaching imparted to the young in turn enriches the research. Innovation is the main component of the quality research and is required for any country if we want to excel. If India has to excel we need many Loyola Colleges. Hence I would like to address on the topic " Innovative Young Minds: empowering India for global leadership.

You know there are many technological advancements happening in India, you will be seeing in the defence area, in robotics, in space. When we take a cell phone or talking to somebody, the person will appear in front of you in a holographic form. That's what is going to happen. The brain will be replaced by a chip. So you can replace anybody's brain into another person's brain. That is possible. Cars will be without drivers. You load the GPS data, roads are all lined up. The road regulations are known to the car. You just sit in the car and read, the car will take you to the place where you want to. The cars can use the petrol or electricity as it likes.

Then the major problems of the human body can be solved by stem cells. Stem cells are within our body only. We have seen

recently in the L V Prasad Eye Hospital more than 100 visually challenged people were cured and they could see. That was done by stem cell injection. You want to go faster, if you want to reach to a place faster, the future is quantum transportation. And then the eco villages and quantum computers, medicines for dreaded diseases, given in the right dose in the right place. There are new things emerging in the world. You are going to see such a world.

There are marvels in the early world which we are not able to repeat. For example the Kallanai of Trichy. You know it was constructed by Karikalan 2000 years before. Nobody can do again the same Kallanai. They don't know what was the technique used by our people at that time to make it. You know there is an iron pillar in Delhi, it is just wrought iron. But there is no rust: why nobody knows why there is no rust. This Nataraja of Chidambarram panchaloga was done by a casting called investment casting which is the latest technology. But our people have done it 1000 years before. You see in temples the stones, you tap the stones: you get sa re ga ma pa. Can we do it now ? It is not possible. So even though world is changing we are also seeing marvels our people have done. But then why we are like this today in India? India's prosperity: why did it come down. India gave Mathematics to the world. India gave medicine to the world. India gave surgery to the world. India gave algebra to the world. India gave cosmology to the world. Everything was given by India 5000 years or two thousand years before. But in the last two thousand years, we were invaded, successively invaded by many and all our wealth have gone and we did not participate even in the Industrial Revolution of the west and we have been put down as a developing country instead of a developed country. That's the situation.

Our prosperity has come down and now we are climbing up during the information age and we entered into an age called knowledge age. India dominated when it was knowledge age. Again the knowledge age has come and what is required for knowledge age people. What type of people are quality people? What quality people are skilled quality people? Where are they? They are sitting here. So that is how, if you generate skilled people in large numbers then again India will be the winner. Is it possible? Yes. We have got 580 million youth today below 35 years. Only India has got. China may be having more population, but youth is only in India. This youth population can completely transform our country again and put at the top in the world. That means global leadership in India is not a dream. It is possible. Where is it? It is with the youth. They are sitting here.

Now can we do technologies in this country? We have seen some of the technology areas where we have taken as a mission mode. We are successful. For e.g in 1942 we were suffering for food. 50 Lakh people died at Bengal for want of food, in 1942. Even in the 60s we were waiting for the PL480 wheat ship to come from USA. That was the situation. Mr C Subramanium who was the Food Minister had a vision to start Green Revolution. Today we have food. We are producing more than 320 million tons of food grains. In India we are making and we have launched the Green

Revolution – II which will take us to 400 hundred million tons of grains. That is what we are aiming at. So food is the basic requirement and the problem is being tackled. But food is not reaching the people. That is distribution. So we should have a proper distribution so that food reaches the people. Milk was not available before independence, a very rare commodity but of nutritional value. Dr. Varghese Kurian who studied in this college started a program for cooperative movement for milk. And now today, India is the largest producer of milk in the world. We are producing nearly 88 tons of milk. We are producing and it has no religion. There is no caste. Everybody drinks the same milk. Like this Green Revolution, Operation Flood then power generation, communication, strategic missiles then space research in all these things we have excelled because of the unified movement called Mission Mode approach.

Now you see how you make a country great. I think I would like to tell all the youngsters and the parents you should know today in the world only five countries are great countries. Only five countries, they are members of the Security Council: USA, Russia, UK, France and China. Five countries who have got the intercontinental ballistic missile, who have the nuclear weapons. They are the members of the Security Council. China has got a place there. India and Pakistan have exploded experiments they have conducted. But they are not the permanent members of the Security Council. They have got the veto power. So you are considered powerful, when you are having weapon. Why do you need weapon? To protect the country. Why do you protect our country? 2000 years we were slaves. You want to be slaves? So you cannot be slaves. We don't want war. But if you are not strong, you are attracting war. That is why we need these weapons.

Dr. Homibaba, said that we must have a nuclear energy program. So he is the father of the nuclear energy program. He made a nuclear India. Today we are looking at nuclear as the energy. It has got a high potential for energy and we are working on how to improve our energy requirement. You know you have so much of power cut. So if you want to solve, you have no other way except going for nuclear. But we have to make it safe. But nuclear is not just for the weapon. Today the doctors do diagnosis done by nuclear energy. All the equipments you are seeing, isotopes for treatment, non invasive imaging techniques, radio pharmaceuticals all these things are part of nuclear energy. Similarly what you are seeing here is the world's first rocket. When we say a space program, the man has landed on the moon. Neil Armstrong has landed on the moon. How did he land on the moon ? He had a rocket. Who invented this rocket ? India invented the rocket. Tippu started using rockets. In the second war he used more than 6000 of these rockets which were made at Srinrangapattinam near Mysore and in the war he defeated the British. But the British took away these rockets. Our rocket is in London but with a caption that this was the rocket first ever used and it was used by Tipu in 1792 and the British were defeated. The British themselves have written this. And so they have acknowledged. Only in India people don't know. Otherwise India was the inventor of rocket and that spread to Europe. From Europe it went to Russia and America. And that is how Neil Armstrong landed on the moon.

Dr. Vikram Sarabhai started the space program for India and for the development we have many rockets called the PSLV, GSLV and we have got many satellites in the orbit. These are all very important things for our life. Everybody has got mobile phone today because of these satellites. These are the remote sensing satellites called cartosat launched by the polar satellite launch vehicle.

Similarly, you have communication. The television: you are watching 24 hours television because of these satellites. You are watching telemedicine: that means a hospital which is not having a super speciality doctor can get the advise directly from super speciality hospital. For e.g Port Blair. There is only one MBBS doctor. He is attached to the Ramachandra Hospital here. So they are in line. All the data are transferred here. Super specility doctor advises the whole Andaman Nicobar.

Similarly classrooms: tele-education. People who have not studied. Satellite is reaching their homes. Tele- health, telesurgery, a doctor in New York recently carried out a tele surgery to a patient in Paris. Patient is in Paris, he is doing the operation but sitting in New York through satellite. That is called telesurgery. Very successfully he did the gall bladder surgery. That means doctors can be anywhere. But you need the facilities at the place where you do it. That is called the robotic surgery. Similarly the weather data, cyclone, Tsunami coming. How do you know? You know through the satellite. Now recently one big development has happened in India. 473 village resource centers have been created. That means it is going to the place where the people can use the satellite information. For e.g I know my place, I am from Kannyakumari District. The fishermen, when I went and saw them, before they go for early morning fishing they see the pictures in their resource centre where fish is available. They can find out from the satellite. Then they go to that place. They will take the big catch they have got. From there they take the mobile phone and do the business who will give more money. You see mobile communication and satellite remote sensing how is useful to a fisherman. So that is the type of application you have.

Then we send a satellite to the moon, you know Chandrayaan. Our satellite was the first to tell that moon has got water. That's why every time we do something, we do something different. Now we have got a big plan. Having achieved a big mission, now the second Chandrayaan is going materialise. It takes the material and sends you what type of resources the moon has got. But later we need man to go to moon for that you have to have first manned missions. Man has to be sent to the space and bring back and then we should finally land him on the moon to a factory. Why we need moon mission, Indians are working on the moon. Earlier days nothing was there. We say thiraikadal thedi and thiraikadal odi. Now we have seen all places in the world. Now we have to go out of the space and look for it. So this place moon, has got very rare material called helium3. This material is available in abundance on the moon's surface. If you can bring back, that is going to be the future energy source. That is why the basic research today has been tuned how to use helium 3 to generate energy. It is very powerful material. That is why the people are interested and seven countries have already planned to settle on the moon. Regionwise they want to go there and want to take material and bring back.

Now let us see the war scenario. This is human centric warfare. The number of people more means the king wins the war. But later in the world war it became platform and weapon centric. Rockets came in, big rockets. Military satellites, planes, bombers, cruise missiles, nuclear submarines, all started coming in. But the future warfare is called the network centric warfare. It is difficult to understand but what I am trying to highlight is when we in the future, we have got a warfare called cyber warfare, you talk about information, so information warfare will become a very important thing. Also information becomes one element, it connects all the hardware. If you are having weapons, satellites, platforms everything can be networked and with minimum use you can give maximum damage to the enemy. Maximum damage is not killing the people; to remove all important assets. That is what the future war is. That is where the intelligence is required and youth power has to be used in the intelligence work. Now India needs power. I told you about the nuclear energy but you need power to take the nuclear payload to a distance, the enemies' place, missiles have to come. This is a derivative of rocket technology.

Today India has critical re-entry technology. That was proved in the Agni. When all people launched missile they are called ballistic missile, if you throw a stone how a stone travels that's the trajectory the missile will take. And all the world they have done like this. We are doing a maneuverable trajectory. First time in the world it was done in India. That is what I am saying. Our minds are great minds. The youth sitting here, after studying in Loyola College, they are not small minds. Your minds are powerful. But you should know you are powerful. If you think I am a dull guy, you'll be a dull guy. If you think I am a great, you will be a great guy. That's the difference. It makes all the difference to you. We are a protected nation. Once you are a protected nation all developments will happen. Peace only can bring progress. These are some of the contributions from the Institutions, they have found out how to do the re-entry mission and how to develop a super computer. It was all developed by young people.

We are conceptually different. Now other countries are also bringing out the 3 dimensional things equal to what we have done. But we have done it nearly twenty years back. Then sanjeeveni is a devise used to identify the movement of the submarine in the water. That we have used in the earth quake of Gujarat, saved lives. So it can measure sound vibration of the acoustics upto 30 mtrs. So we could save many lives. This is in the disaster management authority they have got with them.

This supersonic cruise missile what we have developed flies at a speed of 3 times faster than sound. What is the advantage of being faster. If you go fast you can finish of the enemy reaction time. We have high precision missiles. This is land to land missile in Pokran. So today in the whole world we are now leading as No. 1 in the cruise missile, because we could hit a target at less time, no reaction time and high kinetic energy. American and European missiles, all are behind us. So if there is a will there is a way. So you have to become global leader.

Why I thought of telling this to you is because Loyola is a Research Institution, I have seen some of the world level researches being done here.

But we need knowledge for that. That is why knowledge people are required. 580 million people whom we are having India has got advantage and the world says India will have the top, high quality, high strength.. This is world analysis. We are the top most people to have high quality and more man power. And we should give to the globe our man power. The man power should be everywhere in the globe and beyond the globe on Moon, on Mars. So that type of people we have to create and education with research. Of all the things you need education with value system. And then you will see, India becoming the leader.











GRADUATION DAY

CHIEF GUEST'S ADDRESS Hon'ble Shri C.K. VASAN

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I am happy to be present here at the 84th Graduation Day Ceremony of Loyola College.

Whenever I visit an educational institution, I am reminded of Perunthalaivar Kamaraj, who strove hard to make education affordable to the poorest of the poor, introduced the path-breaking mid-day meal scheme to attract children from the lower strata of society to enrol in schools and also brought in the system of wearing uniform so that there is no discrimination between the haves and have nots. He took the initiative to establish at least one school in every village to ensure that children did not have to travel long distances for pursuing studies.

The contribution of Jesuits towards the cause of education, especially higher education is tremendous. They still run the best educational institutions in India - be it the Loyola College in Chennai, St. Xaviers in Ranchi, St. Xaviers in Mumbai or St. Xaviers in Kolkata.

Since 1540, from the days of St., Ignatius of Loyola, the founder of the Jesuit congregation, the Society of Jesus, commonly referred to as Jesuits have been serving the cause of education the world over for nearly five centuries. This is indeed very commendable.

In this context, I can boldly say that India stood as one of the best beneficiaries, with great Jesuit Fathers like St. Francis Xavier, the great saint who served India, Father Robert de Nobili, the founder of the Madura Mission, and Father Beschi, who is affectionately referred to as Veerama Munivar served Tamil Nadu with much devotion and sacrifice. Father Nobili, who was spearheading the Madura Mission was responsible for establishing many institutions in Tamil Nadu.

Of course, in Tamil Nadu, we can never forget Veerama Munivar for his contribution to Tamil literature and his tireless work among the poor and downtrodden in the region of south Tamil Nadu. They all reached out to people's needs and that is the, reason that made them great.

On this great occasion, I wish to state that the Loyola family is a part of a great tradition.

Loyola has been growing from strength to strength over several generations. Their latest addition, "Loyola--IACM" Engineering Institution is yet another feather in their cap with LIBA and the Teachers Training Institute. I only wish and pray that this grows into a University of Excellence in the years to come.

Swami Vivekananda said: "We want that education by which character is formed; strength of mind is increased, the intellect is expanded and by which one can stand on one's own feet. Education is the manifestation of the perfection already in man."

Our educational institutions have to play a key role in preparing young adolescents to confront the challenges of life since it is here that their attitudes are to be fine tuned so that their transformation to adulthood is smooth.

In the Indian ethos, search for knowledge is deeply ingrained. The quest for knowledge is critical for understanding the self, the society around us and also

the universe. A verse from the Upanishads 'tamaso ma jyotirgamaya', which means lead me from darkness to light, reflects this approach.

Speaking at Allahabad University in 1947, Pandit Jawaharlal Nehru said: "A university stands for humanism, for tolerance, for reason, for progress, for the adventure of ideas and for the search for truth. It stands for the onward march of the human race towards even higher objectives. If the universities discharge their duties adequately, then it is well with the nation and the people." His ideals have been the guiding force behind the evolution of our educational system.

The Government of India came out with the National Education Policy, 1986. The policy emphasised the role of education thus: "Education is a unique investment in the present and the future. This cardinal principle is the key to the National Policy on Education."

The policy urged that in the context of the unprecedented explosion of knowledge, higher education had to become dynamic as never before, constantly entering uncharted areas.

Education can play a positive role in decreasing social disparities. Dr. B. R. Ambedkar, the Chairman of the Drafting Committee of our Constitution said: 'I firmly believe in the efficacy of education as a panacea for our social evils.'

When India became independent, we had only 20



Universities and 500 Colleges located in our country. There were only around a hundred thousand students enrolled for higher education. The number of women who graduated every year were just about a couple of dozen. The evolution of our educational system in the following decades was a result of the policies which reflected the aspirations of the people.

At present there are 544 universities and university-level institutions. There are 31,324 colleges including approximately 2565 women's colleges. At the beginning of academic year 2010-11, the total number of students enrolled in the universities and colleges has been reported at 146.25 lakhs, out of which enrolment of women students was 60.80 lakhs constituting 41.60% of the total enrolment.

With high quality education getting increasing attention, the initiatives of the UPA Government like the enactment of the Right to Education Act to ensure inclusive growth of all sections of the society demonstrate the thrust being given to the field of education. Keeping in mind the need to provide adequate funds for higher education, the budgetary allocation has been raised by about 11.5 per cent from 72,90,00,000 in 2010-11 to Rs. 81,21,00,000 in 2011-12,

Dear students, as you earn your degrees and take up careers in India and abroad, you should not stop the pursuit of educating yourselves. You should enrich yourselves by updating your knowledge and also by learning from experience.

"Man is neither mere intellect, nor the gross animal body, nor the heart or soul alone. A proper and harmonious combination of all the three is required for the making of the whole man and constitutes the true economies of education", said Mahatma Gandhi.

Since harmony and unity with the universe can best be realised through the purification of the mind and soul, our educational system aims to promote harmonious relationship between both the inner and outer dimensions of the individual and his environment.

The aim of our educational system is aptly summarized in the philosophy adopted by Loyola College, which says, "Education does not lie in the quantification of knowledge. But it lies in the quality of knowledge that helps form the character of students." With a strong belief in this philosophy the college has been able to ensure that the students who graduate from here become competent, committed, creative and compassionate citizens of our society.

The values imparted by our educational institutions no doubt stand our students in good stead in their professional life. 




400th death anniversary of Rev.Fr. Christop Calu, a Jesuit priest worked in the reformation of calendar along with Pope Gregory XIII.

VI. M Sc Statistics

Outreach Programme offered by the Department of Outreach, Loyola College Chennai is a mandatory course offered to all PG Students in the College



during their academic course. The course is implemented in two phases. The Phase 1 of the Programme was implemented during December 13-18, 2010 wherein the students visited "Mel Tiruttani" and got awareness on various social issues that have caused havoc in our society.

The Phase 2 of this programme is aimed at the slums within Chennai City through social interventions. The theme allotted to the Department of Statistics was "Drug Addiction and Alcoholism". The key objective was to spread awareness against this major issue of our society. It began on July 13, 2011 with an awareness programme for us. This was followed by frequent visits to a slum "Rajiv Gandhi Nagar" which is located close to the campus. We got an opportunity to interact with the people in the slum, understand the impact of Drug Addiction and Alcoholism and spread awareness on the same.

On February 14, 2012 the II M.Sc. Statistics students organized a Programme as part of their campaign against Drug Addiction and Alcoholism in Chennai High School, Thiruvalluvarpuram, Choolaimedu and in Rajiv Gandhi Nagar with complete support from Smt. A Jeya, Principal (Chennai High School), the students and staff of the school, Shri T. Perumal (Community Leader), faculty members Dr. Martin Luther William, Dr.S Thobias (In-charge, Outreach Activities) and Outreach coordinator Mr. John Kaviarasu.

The outreach rural camp for the first M.Sc. Statistics students comprising of 25 students was scheduled from 12th December 2011 to the 18th December 2011 to Arpakkam in Kanchipuram district. The objective of this camp was to give the students a rural experience and understand their livelihood through a direct and practical experience by pulling them out of their cradle of comfort which they experience in the metropolitan city such as Chennai, and offering them no more than a place to sleep and food to eat prepared by the villagers themselves to thoroughly understand them by living amongst them in their every own environment. The activities performed in the camp such as building an ideal village even before visiting the village gave the insight as to what the students perceived the villages to be, students who have only seen villages either in geographic channels or read about them in books. In the following two days students were asked to visit 2 villages and ask questions about their standard of living and the troubles they face and give a report on the same also were asked to give ideas or suggestions on how to develop their villages and present the same on the last day of outreach. The Department of statistics was very supportive for this cause as Mr. Ruban and Mr. Selvam accompanied the students to the camp and stayed with them the entire week and in turn giving the students the moral boost which they required to face challenges in the days to come and due to which the camp was concluded successfully.

ADMISSIONS:-

Loyola hostel is a mini global village. Students from different countries and states, different cultures and languages, different classes and religions flock together as one Loho family in Loyola Nest. There are around 1250 inmates and 250 Mess only students from sports, Arts & Science college, LIBA, College of Education and LICET. Hostel administration with six assistant directors, has been generous in accommodating as many as possible from all institutions and render our service in every possible way. Thanks to the tireless works of our staff Mr. Manimaran, Mr.Doss, and Mr.Louis in the office.

FEE CONCESSIONS:-

Loyola hostel creates ambience for the students from rural background and first generation learners to excel in their academics. To lighten their economic burden we have made efforts to help nearly 230 students through fee concessions. Jesuit community generously contributes Rs.70000 every month towards concession. Rs.30000 was given for 20 students from Fr.Casimir raj, Director of Alumni Association for concession. This year responding to signs of the times the hostel management has given special concession to the students from Cuddalore and Villupuram district that were affected by the cyclone "Thane". Nearly 17 visually challenged hostellers are given full fee concession through the generous help of Model Resource centre for disability service (MRCDS).

Loyola Lending Library is another feather on the cap enabling students to use their free time productively in reading and reflecting. Within short span of time we have been able to treasure 150 books on personality and confidence building, leadership, general knowledge, stories and novels etc.

STUDENTS' UNION DAY


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The Students' Union Day was celebrated on March 16th, 2012.





We celebrated 5th Birth anniversary of FOP in our college on 13th Feb 2012 with **Thiru.G.Louduswami**, State Administrative Officer of FOP and the **Prof.I.A.J.Jeyadoss**, The Dean of Student Affairs and the Founder Faculty Advisor of FOP in Loyola College.

RESOURCE CENTER FOR THE DIFFERENTLY- ABLED (RCDA)

Loyola College, Chennai is one of the very few colleges in the city that extends its whole hearted support for the education of the differently-abled students. Over the years, several developments have taken place in the portals of Loyola to facilitate the education of the many differently abled students in the college.

In the academic year under the guidance of the Principal, Rev. Dr. B. Jeyaraj S.J. the resource centre has taken many initiatives for the differently-abled students to help them develop on par with the others. The Resource Center for the Differently-Abled organized many programmes exclusively for the differently-abled students with the financial support of NIVH and the UGC (HEPSN) fund.

RCDA is facilitating the differently abled students of our College and other Colleges in all their academic programmes throughout the academic year in the following areas,

Computer Training, Scanning, Proof Reading, Sighted printout, Braille Printout, Photo Copies .

The Centre is generating Econtent study materials of the visually challenged as per the requirements. For the first time, in Tamilnadu RCDA generated content for Tamil literature students by manual typing which was very much useful for the visually challenged students. Faculty in Staff and volunteers charge, contributed their might for the Econtent generation even on holidays. With the continuous support of Loyola management RCDA has



provided Braille papers for Rs.20,000. In the month of July and August the centre has conducted training Basic Computer Literacy programming language for the differently abled students of our college. About 20 students regularly attended the classes and course completion certificates were given to the participants. On all working days, regular Tamil typewriting class was organized for the visually challenged students every year. This year the centre introduced attendance system for the differently abled students to motivate them to use the resources as a result of which around 60 students were making use of the centre daily and all categories of Differently Abled students like Ortho



and Dyslexia are also making use of the centre. With all the efforts taken by the centre all the differently abled students are scoring good marks in their examinations and all of them have passed in all the examinations.

Centre took special efforts to offer counseling for two psychologically disturbed students and accompanied them. As a result both of them were regularly attending the classes and studying well.

Alumni, visually challenged graduates and post graduate students, M.Phil. and Ph.D Scholars, B.Ed College students, from various Colleges in Chennai and other parts of Tamilnadu and visually challenged Professors were also benefited by using the resource centre. Many students from other colleges are using the resource centre for the preparation of competitive examinations like UPSC as the centre is having the E-content of the syllabi covering such examinations.

Prof. J. Amirtha Lenin and Prof. Arockia Anto Anita were appointed as Deputy Director and Assistant Director respectively. In addition one new staff has been appointed as a coordinator cum social worker to the MRCDS from 27th November 2011. Shri D. K. Patel from Hong Kong has also sponsored one more additional staff Mr. Arputharaj to be in charge of sports. Sports classes were conducted from 8th February 2012, three days in a week in which most of the differently abled students are actively participating.

This academic year, Centre provided free Education and accommodation for all the UG I year students and for II and III year students who did their schooling in St.Louis Institute for Deaf and Blind from the sponsored amount of Rs.3, 33,088 by Help the Blind foundation. Also some of the centre students received scholarship from Jaigopal Garodia Foundation. Centre took efforts to provide special motor cycle for a differently abled student of our College from the Department for the Welfare of Differently Abled Persons, Govt. of Tamilnadu. On the day of Feast of St.Ignatitus Loyola all the first year visually challenged students were given I- pod free of cost by Loyola Rotract Club. The Centre with the support of Help the Blind Foundation have managed complete expenses of most of the visually challenged students staying in Loyola hostel.

The centre renewed the MoU with National Institute for Visually Handicapped for the next three academic years and started receiving Rs. 4, 08,000/- towards the salary of the staff. Centre is also taking efforts to get maintenance fund for the upcoming academic years. Dr.Arivanandham, Regional Director, NIVH has been visiting the resource centre every month to motivate the Differently Abled students.

A new system of scribe arrangement was introduced this academic year, members of Sri Sathya



Sai Association, Chennai volunteered to be Scribes. Around 400 scribes have helped for the CA and Semester examinations. Prof. J.Amirtha Lenin, the Deputy Director, RCDA was given the additional responsibility as the Coordinator for Semester Examinations of Differently Abled students of Loyola, by the college Management.

In order to make the students computer literate, the resource centre planned to organize a basic training programme in computer application and C program with the approval of the Management. Final year students from various departments like English, Tamil, Commerce and so on were given the opportunity.

Every month the resource centre was organizing students meet to get the feedback of the activities and to fulfill the needs as much as possible with the support of College management and the staff meeting was also conducted to review and to plan the work.

The resource centre has mobilized students contribution by selling the flag towards celebration of International White Cane Day for the blind in the month of July by Indian Association for the Blind, Madurai.

Officials from various organizations, educational institutions have visited our resource centre as an observatory visit. Mrs.Prabhavathy, In-Charge of Differetly Abled Resource Centre, Bharathidasan University visited our centre in the month of September 2011and Rev.Fr.Director, DEDC, Gujarat visited our centre in the month of January 2012. Mr.Thirumavalavan M.P. visited the centre in the month of March 2012 and appreciated the efforts taken by the centre for the welfare of the Differently Abled students. B.Ed students from Loyola College of Education along with the Prof.R.M.Tamilselvan, Faculty In-Charge for special education visited the centre on 12^{th} March 2012.

Input session on Employment Opportunities for the Differently Abled was organized by the Resource Centre in August 2011. K.Sujatha, Buisness Administrator, Ablejob Visionary Services, Chennai was the resource person. Most of the students have actively attended the program. A special lecture on Sports for the differently abled students was organised by the centre in July 2012. The resource person was Mrs.Madhavi, Manager, Scope International. She handled the session by using the audio and video system in the centre.

With the objective of creating awareness on rights among the Differently Abled students the centre has organized a Lecture on 14.12.2011. The program was inaugurated by Rev. Dr. B. Jeyaraj S.J and Mr. T. M. N. Deepak, Vice President, Tamil Nadu Differently Abled Federation delivered the keynote address. Centre has conducted E-competitions.

On 19.12.11 UGC officials visited the resource centre and encouraged the differently abled students. Three of our centre' students conducted cultural programmes and their performance was appreciated by the committee members and the college management.

Mr.D.K.Patel, Founder, Help the Blind Foundation, Hong Kong along with his wife and other officials from Chennai visited the Centre and had an official meeting with Rev. Fr. Principal, Rev. Fr. Secretary and the Faculty- In-charge for Sports and music. They accepted to fund sports and music classes and gave Rs. 5 lakh for sports and Rs.3 lakh for music. The Loyola College Employees Co-operative Thrift and Credit Society Ltd, which was started in the year 1961 and has completed its 50 years of functioning in service of its members.

During the year ending 31st March 2011 4 members resigned due to retirement from service. While 23 members were admitted as Associate members. The total member is now 239.

The share capital of the Society is **Rs.37,34,390/-** and the total deposit from the members as Thrift deposit is **Rs. 12,844,430.08** during the year amount of loan issued is

Rs.36,207,000/- and a sum of **Rs.29,730,815/-** is recovered from members The loan outstanding as on 31/3/2011 is **Rs.30.046,791/-**

A sum of **Rs.47,63,327/-** has been collected from members as Fixed Deposit and **Rs.3,69,200/-** as Recurring Deposit and giving maximum interest of 11%.

During the year a dividend 14% on the paid up share capital was distributed to the members. The maximum borrowing power of individual members is **Rs. 5 Lakh**; simultaneously the repayment period is 120 months.

The Society is managed by a special officer Tmt.V.Sita S.G.Co-op.Sub.Registrar who is appointed by the Govt.of Tamil Nadu and a Secretary Tmt.S.Dhanalakshmi

INTRODUCTION

Loyola Outreach programme, now an activity of the Loyola Outreach Department, was introduced in Loyola College during the academic year 2001-2002, with a view to making the students experience and express concern for the society, especially the poor and the needy. The idea of this extension programme is to make Loyola College a role model for serving the neighbourhood community. With this spirit, the Outreach unit works in collaboration with Chennai Corporation, slum clearance board, and the schools in the neighbourhood ever since its inception. To make the initiative very meaningful, the second year undergraduate students of both aided and self-supporting courses from all departments, numbering to about 1850 students are involved in various activities. The activities are streamlined and focused on women, children and youth covering health, Literacy, women empowerment and other concerns of our times.

AREAS ADOPTED

The neighbourhood areas covered under this project are zones 5, 7, and 8 which comprise of 76, 77, 78,107,108,118 and 120 which include slums in and around Choolaimedu, Nungambakkam, Chetpet and Kodambakkam areas. Totally we are involved in 25 slums for community service.

IMPORTANT AND COMMON PROGRAMMES HELD AT LOYOLA COLLEGE

Orientations, Training Programmes and Seminar for the Outreach Students



In order to make the students understand the dynamism of outreach programme, all the second year UG students were given common Orientation in the month of July 2011. Each session started with a prayer song followed by the Welcome Address by Outreach staff. The programme was presided over by our Principal Rev. Dr. B. Jeyaraj S.J,

Rev. Dr. G Joseph Antony Samy S.J (Director, Department of Outreach), and resource persons motivated the students in different sessions. This orientation motivated the students and prepared them to do community service. Later in the month of August and September 2010, the students were given thematic training on environmental

awareness, intervention with school children, anti- drug addiction and alcoholism. Every month students were evaluated in order to render better services for the community.

Some of the key areas focused were Internet guidance, Daily work for success, Think big to achieve big and SWOT analysis. Rev.Dr. Mahalingam, and John Sundar - Vice Principals of Loyola College spoke on the necessity of education and hard work to come up in life. Dr.Gladston Xavier concluded the programme highlighting the importance of carrier guidance and how students should toil hard to come up to the higher level.

SCHOLARSHIP DISTRIBUTION FOR HIGHER EDUCATION TO THE STUDENTS FROM SLUMS STUDYING IN VARIOUS COLLEGES

In collaboration with Give Life Trust in the month of August, 120 college students from slums studying in various colleges in Chennai were given tuition fee for continuing their higher education. Rev.Fr.G.Joseph Antony Samy S.J., Vice – Principal and Director of Outreach was the Chief Guest and gave felicitations.

COMMUNITY LEADERS MEETING HELD ON 17TH AUGUST, 2011

The community leaders meeting was held on 17th August, 2011 at MRF hall in the presence of Rev.Fr. G. Joseph Antony Samy S.J., Director – Dept of Outreach and Prof.Gladston Xavier, Asst Director of Outreach. The main purpose of the meeting was to avail the service of community leaders as animators of the students in the respective areas and make them realize their responsibility to become partners of development.

Director of Outreach asked the Community Leaders of the slums to find a place to plant trees wherever space is available. He added that cleanliness is very important in slum areas. He asked the leaders to be of help to the students to conduct various need-based programme in the slums.

DISTRIBUTION OF EDUCATIONAL ASSISTANCE TO POOR CHILDREN AND BLANKETS TO SENIOR CITIZENS

On 3rd December 2011, the department of Outreach distributed blankets to 1200 senior citizens. The Blankets were sponsored by RCC platinum Trust. The transit school is opened to give education in Hindi and Odiya to these children so that when they go back to their native places they have the basics and they can enroll themselves in school, in order to continue their studies.

PROGRAMME HELD IN NEIGHBOURHOOD SLUMS

Literacy Day Celebration in Corporation School

In the month of September 2011 was celebrated as Literacy day in 7 corporation schools and 23 slum communities by the students of Outreach. To make this day a memorable one, the school students were given a chance to participate in different competitions and the winners were awarded with prizes.

PROGRAMME FOR SCHOOL CHILDREN

The students of school teaching groups did remedial coaching in Chennai schools run by the corporation of Chennai. They conducted talent competitions, sports day, annual day, Teacher's day, Literacy day and children's day. They commemorated the important days such as Republic Day and Independence Day. Moreover, they celebrated important days such as Pongal, Deepavali and Christmas and conducted career guidance programme, speech and drawing competitions and other awareness programme. The school teaching groups totally conducted 22 programmes benefiting to 1225 children.

PROGRAMME FOR BALWADI CHILDREN

10 programmes such as nutrition day, children's day, pediatric health camps, pongal and the celebrations such as Christmas day, Pongal, New Year, Deepavali, Independence Day, and drawing competition were conducted. Total beneficiaries are about 300 in 15 slums.

MEDICAL CAMPS, HEALTH AWARENESS PROGRAMMES AND RALLIES

4 General Medical Health camps and 2 eye camps were conducted for the community people. The Outreach students organized more than 18 awareness programmes to the community people and school children on various issues such as anti-pogi awareness, cancer, Dengue fever, Malaria fever, Mosquito Awareness, Chickun Gunya, Breast feeding, HIV/AIDS, Environmental Cleanliness, Health and Hygiene, communicable and non communicable diseases. These awareness programmes were beneficial to 1014 people.

PROGRAMME FOR WOMEN

In the beginning, Rapport building was done with women by conducting different competitions such as Kolam competition, Rangoli competition and cooking competition and in particular lucky corner competition was conducted to widows. Then systematically awareness programmes such as Child-care, domestic violence, women's day celebration, counseling drive and so on were conducted. Totally 27 competitions and programmes were conducted which was beneficial to 702 women.

PROGRAMME FOR YOUTH GROUP

In the beginning of outreach programme to build up a rapport with youth, friendly matches such as carom board, cricket matches and kabadi were conducted. Awareness programmes on various topics such as alcohol and drug abuses, job and employment, personality development and leadership training were conducted. About 15 programmes of such kind were conducted, benefiting to 542 youth.

PROGRAMME FOR TUITION CHILDREN

Totally 12 evening tuitions are handled by hostellers in the outreach areas which are beneficial to about 450 school children. Various competitions such as speech, poem writing, essay writing and drawings were conducted for the students of evening tuitions and the winners given prizes.

PROGRAMME FOR ELDERS AND DIFFERENTLY ABLED

Elders' day was celebrated in slums. Under OAP scheme, about 45 applications for getting old age pension were submitted to the government. About 120 people were given bed sheets as a Christmas gifts by outreach students. With the



help of Lion's Club, two differently abled people were given wheel chairs.

INAUGURAL FUNCTION OF A NEW STUDY CENTRE AT MUTHUMARIAMMAN NAGAR SLUM:

Inaugural function of a new study centre at Muthumariamman slum took place on 8th Sept 2011: Rev. Dr. B. Jeyaraj SJ, opened the study centre and greeted the student's effort and congratulated the students to be a role model for others. He asked the children and their parents to make use of this study centre for education and empowerment. Rev. Dr. G. Joseph Antony Samy,SJ., Director ,Department of Outreach said that by making use of this study centre, school students must get first rank and also he announced prizes for the first rank holders. He greeted the Outreach students and asked them to work for the tangible development of the slum dwellers by their committed efforts. 42 school going children, 10 youth and 20 parents participated in the function along with the students of II B.Sc Computer Science in the programme.

LOYOLA EXTENSION AWARENESS PROGRAMME (LEAP)

CORE COMMITTEE MEETING

On 8th September, 2010 the Department of Outreach organized the core committee meeting at MCA SMART room. Nine members participated and reviewed the last year activities and shared their opinions. A team from the department of Outreach that had already visited rural camp places presented the report and its possibilities for having rural camp to get the approval from core-committee members.

URBAN INTERVENTION BY SECOND YEAR POST GRADUATES

The second year post graduates who attended training progamme in the last academic year were placed in 15 slums in Zone 5, 7 and 8. As part of slum intervention, the students conducted programme both in school and community from August, 2011 to February 2012. The student spread awareness programme on Civic sense, mental health, Domestic Violence, Transgender issues, and Anti -Alcoholism and Drug addiction and Rights of the differently abled. Finally, the students submitted completion report to the dept.

I POST GRADUATE

In this academic year, the programme started with orientation on 20 th November, 2011 at Lawrence Sundaram Auditorium for Shift-I &II separately to make the students understand the concept of Outreach programme and to develop social consciousness before entering into rural villages. Rev.Dr.Jerry S.J motivated the students to have rural exposure.

RURAL CAMP FOR THE FIRST YEAR POST GRADUATES

Rural camp was conducted for first year postgraduate students from 21 - 26 th November 2011, 12 – 17 December, 2011, 9 – 14 January 2012 and 27th Feb to 3 rd March 2012. Around 475 students attended the rural camp. The camp was organized in six different places in Kancheepuram and Tiruvallur districts. The rural camp places are Ongur, Ammaiyappanallur, Arapakkam, Sengattur, Valarpuram, Gandhipet and Tirutani.

On the first day of the rural camp, students were given a half day orientation in the college campus and after that the students were taken to rural places to experience rural realities. The second day was the field level orientations handled by experience persons.

On the third and fourth day, students went for village visits and had interaction with people about social, economic and cultural aspects. Village visits exposed the students to rural reality; understand the felt needs of the villages and life style of people, and gave knowledge to students to do social analysis.

End of the fourth day, all students went to one village and gave awareness on social problems and social evils to village people in the form of skits and dramas. This made the villagers to become aware of the pressing problems of their villages and made them understand about the ways and means of overcoming from the problems, poverty and illiteracy.



On the 5th day, students presented their experience and learning through skit and chart in the summing up session. The evaluation was handled by professors from Loyola College. On the 6th Day, the students submitted their reports and planed for slum intervention programme.

LOYOLA REACH OUT CAFÉ

INTRODUCTION

The outreach program of Loyola College was started in the year 2001. The objective of the program is to initiate neighborhood development with the help of students. Sophomores from all departments are expected to spend a minimum of 120 hours in community service. Though the course was started as a non credit compulsory requirement it eventually became a 4 credit compulsory program.

The program is run in collaboration with the Corporation of Chennai, the Tamil Nadu Slum Clearance Board and the State Resource Center. These organizations provide technical advice on issues of crucial importance.

Currently the programs cater to Zones 5, 7 and 8 of the Chennai Corporation. There is 6 staff that coordinates about 1800 students from 25 departments with 25 staff in-charge of their respective departments.

Over the years the outreach department has been able to make sustained impact on the community in the areas of community health and hygiene, women empowerment and child education. Since the program is conducted with the help of students short term interventions leading to long term impacts are envisaged.

Being in constant touch with the community enabled the program to understand other specific needs of the community. The widows program is bears witness to the need based programs. During our regular community need's assessment it was found that widows who are above the age of 50 were identified as one of the most vulnerable groups. Efforts to help them were undertaken with the contributions of philanthropists. Monthly rations were distributed for over a year.

As a result of our interventions in the community, more students were inspired to take up higher education in colleges. Due to lack of funds they were found to be dropping out of college. Further inquiry led to a greater understanding the needs of the students.

The needs of the community were larger than the resources available. Hence a social entrepreneurship effort was undertaken. The word was passed around to people of good will. Mr Mahadevan, CEO of Oriental Cuisines readily responded. The Loyola model was to emulate the preexisting Winner's Bakery.

As a joint investment Loyola College along with the Oriental Cuisines set up the Give Life Café on 5th September 2008.

GOAL

To enable an equitable development of the community through institutional involvement.

OBJECTIVES:

- · To help the poor and Marginalized especially children and youth living in Slums come up in education and employment.
- · To make the poor and the marginalized develop Entrepreneurial Skills.
- · To help students of Loyola with part time jobs.
- · To provide quality food at an affordable cost to our students.
- To spend all the surplus money earned through this outlet only for the welfare of poor students in Loyola and for the slum children in our Neighborhood.

TATA-LOYOLA KOVALAM OUTREACH PROJECT

In 2005, TRC (TATA Relief Committee) teamed up with Loyola College to create a TATA-Loyola Outreach Project to assist the overall development of the Kovalam Village. In 2008, as the projects taken up by the TRC were completed, the TRC Chennai branch was closed. Thereafter, the Fisherman's Cove Hotel and Loyola College together assumed management of the Kovalam Community Center. The center currently runs three main programs: 1) a community college that offers one-year vocational training programs for youths 2) a tuition center that provides children with a study space, after-school tutoring help, and daily nutrition, 3) Tailoring to the widows, deserted women, dropout adolescent girls and the deserving married women.

The Vocational Training Program of the Kovalam Community College caters mainly to students who have dropped out of the regular educational system and provides them with the opportunity to gain a TNOU (Tamil Nadu Open University) -accredited diploma in one vocational area. The community college takes a holistic approach in educating the student. Apart from vocational education, it seeks to teach students who have dropped out of the regular educational track the following: life coping skills, interpersonal and communication skills.

TATA - LOYOLA TUITION CENTRE

About 100 students are studying at Tata Loyola tuition centre. Students from LKG to class XII are coming regularly for the tuition excepting on Sunday. Totally 6 teachers are tutoring. The children who study here stand first in the schools not only in education but also in extracurricular activities.

The important events took place in the academic year 2011 -12

- Children's Day programme and inauguration of tuition centre took place in the month November 2011.
- Fisherman's Cove Manager, CSR wing incharge, Mr.Laxminarayanan, and Director Tata Loyola Kovalam Community College and other 4 fathers from Loyola College took participation.
- Christmas day celebration was held in the month of December. Rev.Fr. Parish Priest of kovalam and Outreach coordinator were present as the guests.
- · Commemoration of Independence Day and Republic Day was observed in the community college.

CENTRE FOR INTERNATIONAL PROGRAMMES

We have signed MoUs with 14 foreign universities and have student exchange, faculty exchange, research collaboration and joint degree programmes. At the moment, we run four degree programmes with London South Bank University, UK and Lille Catholic University, France, and the student exchange programme with Ingolstadt University, Coburg University, Germany and Albert Le Grande, Angers, France.

COURSES RUNNING CURRENTLY

M.Sc. International Business (London South Bank University, UK)

M.Sc International Business is a three semester course in which students spend their first semester at Loyola College and then move on to London to pursue their second and third semesters before they graduate.

Out of 20 students applied who, 16 students were admitted through written test and personal interview. In this academic year, the post graduate degree program started with the Foundation course to give an insight on the various skills and dynamics needed to cope up the study, followed by regular classes in the core papers. Industrial Visit to Hyundai Motor Ltd and educational tour to Ooty were also successfully organized. Eminent personalities from the industry and B Schools were invited for the special lectures which were well received by the students. A series of case study classes was also conducted to prepare the students to face varied business situations.

After completing tests and assignments with the good academic records, the students are at present in London to continue their second and third semesters. The faculty members and the officials from the LSBU visited our campus to discuss the prospective course of action and to orient our students. Future action plan is sorted to promote the MSc International Business and MSc Corporate Governance along with a prospective course in Marketing and Human Resource Management.

BBA (France) (Lille Catholic University, France)

'BBA-France' is a twinning programme with IESEG School of Management, which is a part of Lille Catholic University, France. Students who enroll for this programme get an opportunity to either pursue a five year integrated programme which culminates with a 'Grande Ecole' degree or they have the option of completing a BBA degree with three years of study offered by IESEG School of Management. The selected students pursue their first two years of study at Loyola and go to IESEG School of Management, France to complete the third year to graduate with a BBA degree.

The admission office of IESEG School of Management is in-charge of the selection and admission process for this programme. This academic year we received an overwhelming response in terms of applications. We received a total of 98 applications. Of these 30 students were provisionally selected through a written test and personal interview. 29 students joined the programme.

An Excel workshop was conducted for the second year students for business statistics and econometrics and it was well received by the students and faculty.

A cross cultural talk was given by

- Ms. Bobby Jacob, Lawyer at ABB (Geneva, Switzerland)
- 2) Mrs. Sumithra Mathew, HR Manager (Polaris) on working in Europe.
- 3) Old students of the BBA course came to advice and inform the present batches on the culture and mode of education at Lille. They included Rohit, Gautam, Varun, Bivin, Aashish, Abhishek, Samuel and Tarun.
- 4) The first years undertook general internships in companies for a period of two continuous weeks during the summer holidays. The internship was done at HPCL, Rajashree Sugars, CLRI, APC ltd.,Air France, Chackiat etc..

There were a series of workshops for the first and second year students in the twinning program at Loyola College. These workshops were back in 2010 for the first time. Since then, the IESEG team have been organising a series of workshops that would initiate the first year students to new learning tools and the second year students to more advanced techniques.

The organisation of these workshops is a result of the experience of the last batch of students and the feedback from students in both campuses.

The workshops concern both the first year and second year students.

The professors involved in the workshop included: Mr. Hicham Daher, Assistant Professor of Finance and Quantitative Methods, Ms. Lies Bouten, Assistant Professor of Financial Analysis, Ms. Raluca Parvulescu, Assistant Professor of Economic Exploration, Ms. Alexandra Svoronou, Assistant Professor of Statistics

The workshops took place from Monday 27th of February to Friday 2nd of March 2012.

The first series were the Economics and Statistics workshops for the first year students. The second series were the Financial Analysis and Econometrics workshops for the second year students. The sessions for the first year and second year students' workshops were held in parallel.

The workshops covered the fundamental materials that would affect the students' thinking and understanding for the future. The sessions were both interactive and practical sessions along with coaching sessions. The coaching sessions aimed to advice students on their final project. Students worked in small groups of 4 students. They worked on two projects, one for each workshop, at the same time. The workshops sessions ended with presentations to defend their presentation work in front of a panel of IESEG and Loyola professors.

Friendly football matches were conducted during the year.

M.Sc., Sustainable Food Manufacturing and Management (Lille Catholic University, France) 2011-2012

This year 4 students enrolled for the programme. After successful completion of the first semester, the students have left to Lille Catholic University for their second semester.

Ms. Emmanuelle Martin, Dr. Audrey and Mr. Eric from our partnering institutions had visited this year.

Seminar on higher Education and job opportunities for Life Scence Graduates in Food processing sector" was organized on March 6, 2012, with Rev. Dr. M. Albert William S.J as the convener and Dr. J. Joel Gnanadoss as the organizing secretary. About 100 students attended the seminar. Lectures were delivered by resource persons from Lille Catholic University, France and a resource person from Sing Venture Halee, a multinational food processing company in India. During the end of the seminar, participants were briefed about the M.Sc. Sustainable Food Manufacturing and Management.

Initiatives on promotions of this programme were carried out by visiting students of various city colleges.

STUDENT EXCHANGE

- Ø Three students postgraduate students from Commerce department will be going to Ingolstadt School of Management, Germany for four-month exchange programme from April 2012. They followed courses of which evaluation transcripts will be received from Ingolstadt School.
- Ø From Ingolstadt School of Management, Germany three students came to Loyola College for exchange programme for a semester. They carry out courses in commerce, economics and BBA.
- Ø Three students from Coburg University, Germany came to Loyola College for exchange programme for a semester in the department of Social work. They will endure their internship for a period of 6 months.
- Ø One student from ITESO Mexico University came to Loyola College for exchange programme for a semester. She followed courses in commerce, History.
- Ø Six Students from France came for the exchange programme for a semester. They pursue courses in commerce, economics and BBA.

RESEARCH PROJECTS

- A research project has been initiated by IDCR on the **Role of religious/moral education in colleges in Chennai city** in providing quality education. It is partly funded by Chennai Corporation and Institute of Classical Tamil Culture. It is at the level of data collection at present.
- The Caste out of Development (The Role of Caste in Development): Dalit rights and International Civil Society Activism-Socio—Cultural Research Project funded by Economic and Social Research Council (ESRC), UK. Coordinated by IDCR along with other NGOs, Chennai and School of Oriental & African Studies, UCL, London.
- **Caste and Violence**: (2007-10) IDCR undertook a field research that looked for the reasons behind violent caste clashes in southern, northern districts in Tamil Nadu. It also tried to identify measures that could prevent caste conflicts. The findings of this study will soon be published as a book (Manohar Publications).

- **Gender Discrimination:** A research project on designing an intercultural and inter-religious model for eradicating gender discrimination has been initiated by Fairfield University (Jesuit), USA and IDCR this year. This inter-cultural and inter-national partnership aims to provide a model for our collective resolve to find solutions to social problems.
- Pilot study has been done with the help of students of Social Work, and Medical Sociology and the data are being entered in SPSSS by a team of lecturers from the Dept of Statistics, Loyola.


Workshop for Non-Teaching Staff was held 17-18. November 2011 – the Non-Teaching staff were trained

NAAC Reaccreditation Process: A team, consisting of Principal, Secretary, IQAC Coordinator, members of the IQAC and a staff member from each department, worked on the department profile and evaluative report (descriptive) of the departments. Towards the end of last academic year 2010-11, the college submitted the Letter of Intent (LOI) on 16th April 2011 to the NAAC.
