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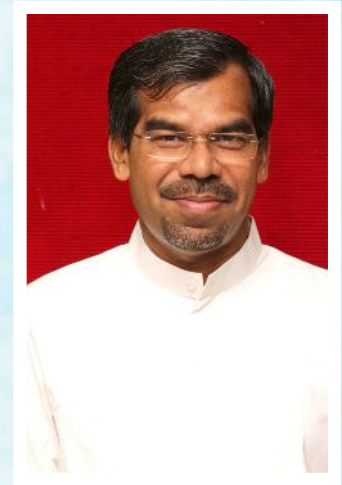

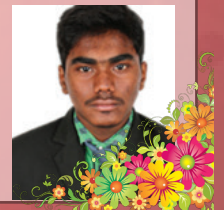

Whenever in life you encounter a situation simply ask a question, does it help me in achieving my goal? If the answer is yes, then go for it if not simply ignore and move ahead. Here just to emphasize the importance of a written goal I will mention a study done by Harvard Business School in the year 1979. Harvard Business School as you know is one of the best in the world. A graduate class of 79' was asked a



simple question about their goals in life. The question was 'Have you set your goals for life? Have you written it and created a plan for it? Prior to graduation it was determined that 84% of them had not set any goals at all. 13% had set written goals but did not have a concrete plan but the rest 3% had set written goals and a concrete plan to achieve them. Can you imagine the results? Well most of you would have guessed it. Ten years later the 13% of the class that set written goals and did not have a concrete plan for it was making twice as much as money as the 84% that did not have any plans. However the apparent kicker is that the 3% that had both written goals and created plans for it was earning ten

times more than the rest 97% of the class. This emphasizes the need for a written goal and a plan to achieve them and now once you set goals you will definitely require some special set of skills to achieve them.

Please remember a saying 'What got you here will not get you there' which means whatever skills you have you have already reaped the benefits of those skills. In case you want to achieve something different, something bigger you have to have a different set of skills. You need to continuously upgrade your skills and keep on attaining more knowledge we need to understand and learn how successful people have become successful. There are different ways by which you can learn first and the easiest way to learn is to learn by your own mistakes. Try, try, and try... till you succeed. How can you learn unless you make mistakes this is what we had been taught in our life try, fail and learn from your mistakes but in the process you have lost already a lot of time, a lot resources and a lot of money. I don't think this is the best option. Second option is to learn from the mistakes of others which will cost them something which is also not desirable to make others pay to make you learn. The best way in my opinion is to learn from the success of the successful people. There are a number of good people, successful people, who are successful in every field. Will it not be a win-win situation to learn from the successful people? But, the big question is how you get hold of the successful people? Will they have enough time to teach you? Even if they are willing to teach, do you have enough time and resources to pay for their time?

The answer would most probably be negative. Then how to learn from them? In our time, when I was in college there



was very little option to get access to these successful people and learn from them. Now with the advent of modern means of communication like T.V, newspaper, Internet, etc... this knowledge is in the reach of every one. Most of the success stories are available on these mediums. You can access these stories at almost no cost. Further good majorities of the people who have been successful in their lives have written their experiences in the form of various books. I strongly recommend that you get these books and read them. Make use of the many books and videos available.

One of the books that I strongly recommend is 'Think and Grow Rich' by Napoleon Hill. This book was written way back in the year 1937. It has sold more than 100 million copies and still remains as sixth bestseller of all time. The book is the result of 20 years of research by Napoleon Hill. It is about the people who had amassed personal fortunes. If you remember 1937 and a few years prior to that was the great depression and these people had survived the great depression. Finally, Napoleon Hill evolved sixteen laws to achieve success. I feel it is a must read for everyone. The second book I recommend is the 'Magic of Thinking Big'. It says "If you think big you may get big but if you think small you will never get big." Get into the habit of reading books.

We spend a lot on good food, exercise and supplements to keep our body fit. Books are the vitamins and nutrients for our brain. Allocate a certain portion of your budget for the food for your brain. Now, the most important part in the process is to achieve goals is action. We plan, plan and plan. We wait for a perfect plan and never take action. Perfection is the biggest enemy of our goal. You can become perfect only by practice reverse is also true, you never become perfect unless you start acting.

To summarise, my sincere advice to you all is to decide a destination, make a goal in life, chalk out a plan to reach there, acquire skills required to achieve the goal and then go aloud to achieve it. But, a small word of caution is sometimes we are in such a hurry to get to the good life that we often

get past it. I would say whatever path you choose in life it important to enjoy the journey as you enjoy the goal. I want to end by asking a question. You know when you leave the college and go out with your batch there will be many people who will say they went to Loyola College. But for only a few, the college will say that they once studied at Loyola College. You have to choose whether you want to be the first type or the second. It is a simple yet strong statement. Do you want your college to say that you are from Loyola College? (Or) Do you want to say I am for Loyola College? Choice is yours. Be worthy of yourself and have a good life. LOYOLA HOSTEL

Their parents desire a transformation of behaviour of their children. Then teachers desire to mould their students into responsible people with knowledge and strength; and others expect greater things to flow from the students at Loyola. With these desires and expectations, a student enters Loyola Campus. Once a student enters Loyola, he searches for the right place to live, and then he finds and steps into the great castle of holistic growth- Loyola Hostel. To say in a nutshell, Loyola Hostel is a ‘treasure house’ where students use the facilities provided to them and gain an all-round growth.

Education, Spirituality, Social identity and Social commitment, Culture, Sports, Edutainment and Discipline form a student who lives at Loyola hostel. Loyola College Hostel makes students to be ‘men for others’ by transforming education into virtues and virtues into actions. It forms the students to identify themselves who they are, so that, they can be available to others who are in greater need.

Administration: Rev. Dr. Sameul Jeyaseelan S.J., is the Director of Loyola Hostel. He animates the administration team to inculcate a holistic growth in the students. The Assistant Directors who join hand with the director are Sch. Regis S.J., Sch. Manickam S.J., Sch. John Paul S.J., Sch. Jeyaraj S.J., Sch. Maria Valan S.J., Prof. Albin John Pradeep, Prof. Suman and Prof. Arul Francis.

Gratitude: Loyola Hostel extends its gratitude to the former Assistant Directors Sch. James Raja S.J., Sch. Gladwin S.J., Sch. Antony Anand S.J., for their commitment and services rendered towards the growth of the hostel.

Admission: 1,400 students were admitted into the hostel from all disciplines in 20 blocks. Visually-challenged students and poor students were given much preference regarding the admission into the hostel.

ACADEMIC FORMATION

Apart from the college, students were guided efficiently in their academic formation. The academic formation comprised of the following.

Daily Study: Students were accompanied and monitored by the Assistant Directors during the study hour from 8.30 p.m. to 10. p.m. They were guided well to reach their goals. Academic counseling was given to the students who found difficult to study. They were given special training to excel in their academics.

Library: The library in the hostel was much useful to the students to gain information from various sources. They were updated with the latest news and information in different fields apart from their regular studies. Students spent the evenings in reading newspapers, journals and magazines.

English Classes: Spoken English Classes for the Tamil medium students from both UG and PG were conducted. The classes invigorated the students to become friendly with the language and use it fluently. Besides the usual English classes, they also learn five new English words daily.

SOCIAL FORMATION

The hostel enabled the students to see beyond their boundaries of self-formation. They reached out to become a part of the sufferings of many in the society at large.

Food distribution to the homeless: Students spent their free time after lunch to distribute food packets

from the hostel to the homeless dwelling at the railway station and along the road. This act of charity imparted social responsibility in them.

Slum Children Programme: Students were shouldered with responsibility to conduct HAPPY DAY for the slum children in the neighbouring vicinity. Hundreds of children participated and were made happy through various programmes. The programme involved many students who spent their valuable time and energy towards the poor children.

Reaching the homeless during winter: Students contributed money in buying new bedsheets in December before Christmas, and reached the homeless in various platforms at the railway stations from Chennai Beach to Tambaram in the night, and distributed the bed sheets to the people who slept on the platform in severe cold during winter.

Science forum: Students from the science discipline came together and discussed various scientific advancement in this club. They conducted many special programmes regarding different fields in science and speakers were invited to give talks on the advancement of science.

Kondraimara Vasagar Vattam: The members in this club discussed literature and involved themselves in reading and reviewing various books and poems written by inspiring authors and poets.

PSYCHOLOGICAL FORMATION

Counseling Programme: Students' counsellors from the college came regularly to conduct counseling sessions for the first year students. 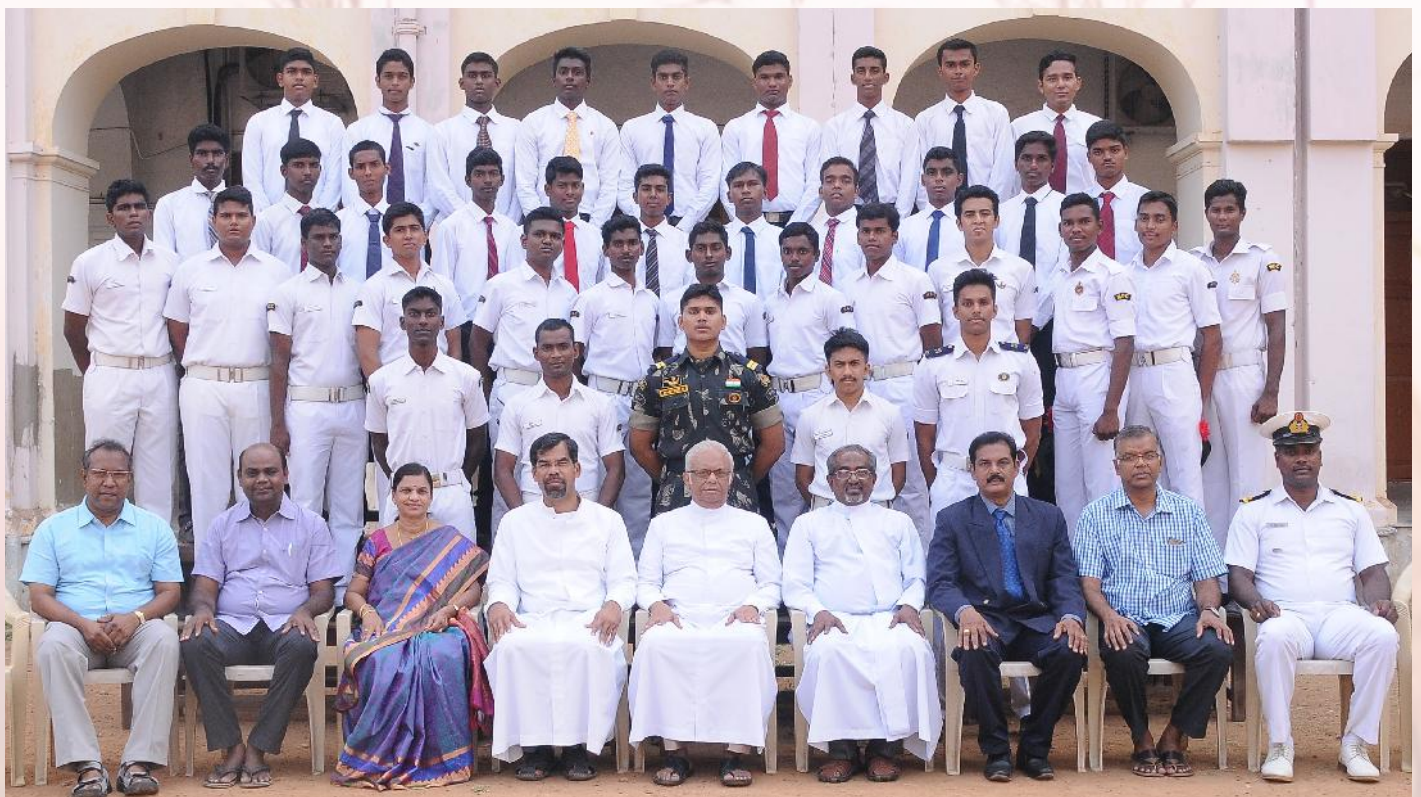

RCDA & MRCDS

Loyola College, Chennai is one of the very few colleges in the city that extend whole hearted support for the education of the differently abled students. Over the years, several developments have taken place in the portals of Loyola to facilitate the education of the differently abled students in the college. To vouch for this fact, Resource Centre for the Differently Abled (RCDA) was established in 2006 with the support of UGC-HEPSN. Additional resources were adopted in 2009 in collaboration with the National Institute of Visually Handicapped (NIVH), Ministry of Social Justice and empowerment, Government of India. It was set up as the Model Resource Centre of Disability Services (MRCDS), the first of its kind in the nation to cater to the needs of the Differently Abled. It aims at empowering such students in their studies and co-curricular activities.

The resource centre is equipped with many specialized devices to enable the visually challenged to grow intellectually and it also has special devices to help other categories of differently abled students in the campus. We extend our services to the visually challenged students outside our College campus also.

FACILITIES

Computers with Screen Reading Software The resource centre is well equipped with the latest version software; JAWS (Job access with speech) and NVDA (Non Visual Desktop Access). ABBYY Fine Reader is an optical character recognition (OCR) system that converts scanned documents, PDF documents, and image files (including digital photos) into editable formats, which can be read through the screen reading softwares.

SCANNERS

Four scanners with easy operations are available in the resource centre. Students can scan their text books and printed study materials and can convert the same in to reading format using the above mentioned softwares.

The College management provides free Internet and Wi-Fi facilities inside the campus.

Special devices Devices such as SARA reader, Braille typewriter, Braille printer, Focus Braille, Angel Readers, Victor Reader, Talking calculator etc is available for the students.

A Battery operated vehicle is available for the differently abled students to commute within the campus.

ACTIVITIES

1. Computer Training class

Regular computer class is conducted on all working days. We emphasize on fingering exercise, screen reading softwares like JAWS and NVDA, MS office, Internet etc.

2. Music Class

A separate room with various music instruments such as the latest model Key boards, Electric guitar, Violin, Guitar, Tablas, Harmonium, Flutes, Drum set, Drum Pad, Miruthangam, Taval, etc

3. Sports Coaching

Special coaching is given by the Physical Education Department for the differently abled students.

4. Input Sessions

Input sessions on Career Guidance, Personality Development, Guidance and counseling, Emotional Stability etc are organized.

5. Arranging Readers and Scribes

Scribes are arranged during the Internal and End semester Examination. This is done in collaboration with voluntary organization, individual volunteers and research scholars of our College. Readers are arranged based on the requirement of the students.

6. Arranging the Sponsors

The College is benevolent to the differently abled students and supports them. Various concessions are given to the differently abled students.

7. Inter and Intra College Competitions

THEIA an Intercollegiate Sports and Cultural meet for the visually challenged is organized every year to bring out their talents. This is a platform through which the Visually challenged students not only exhibit their talents but also to get to know their counterparts from various Colleges in and around Chennai.

8. Summer Camp

A summer camp on Basic Computers and English for communication is held every year in the month of May for the school final visually challenged students.

PROGRAMME

Help the Blind Foundation, Hong Kong has sponsored an amount of Rs.13,20,000 for the hostel accommodation of about 52 visually challenged students.

Orientation was given to the I UG students on the activities of the resource centre in the month of June 2016. Input session on Self-employment was organized in collaboration with the volunteer organization LC Project, Chennai in the month of September 2016. Dr. Sultan Ahmed Ismail, Managing Director of the Eco-science Research Foundation, a not-for profit organization, Chennai was the resource person.

WORLD BLIND WALK was organised by Project Vision, Bangalore on 13th October 2016 at Adayar, Chennai. The purpose of the programme was to create an awareness about eye donation. Visually challenged students of our College and other city Colleges participated.

In the month of November 2016 Mr. D.K. Patel, Founder, Help the Blind Foundation, Hong Kong along with his team members from Chennai met Rev. Fr. Principal for a discussion about the financial support to the visually challenged students.

Members of Sri Sathya Sai Association, Chennai volunteered to be Scribes.

In order to make the students computer literate and encourage them to attend the basic computer classes regularly the resource centre has planned to issue grade certificates from this academic year. In the name of Dr. A.P.J. Abdul Kalam, the visually challenged students of our College are financially helping a differently abled student of our College in paying the College Fees.

Input session on Life scoping skills was held on 1st February 2017. Mr. I. Joseph Arc Leo M.A., M.Phil. An alumnus of our College who is currently working as a Lecturer in SRM University was the resource person.

LOYOLA COMMUNITY RADIO

Loyola Community Radio 107.4 is an initiative of Loyola College that has been actively running for the past twelve years. Medical Officer is available for consultation from 10.30 am to 3.30 pm. To provide optimal health care within the campus, the

Loyola Jesuit Management takes care of the total expenditure incurred towards the creation of essential ambience, and clinical as well as pharmaceutical needs. Rev. Dr .S. Lazar,S.J., Secretary and Correspondent, is the custodian of LHC. The academic year began with its pressing aims and vision; it seeks to raise awareness among the students on general Health & personal hygiene, infectious disease, Mental Health and stress management.

Clinical and Medical Service

Essential infrastructure is available for clinical examination such as haemogram, blood sugar, lipid profile, liver function tests, renal function tests, routine urine analysis, seminal & sputum analysis, stool examination, serum analysis for Typhoid, Malaria, inflammatory disorders, blood grouping & cross matching, screening & identification of Tuberculosis and other bacterial and fungal infections, antibiotic sensitivity tests, pregnancy test and ECG.

Academic Assistance

- Caters to the needs of academic and research activities.
- Provides infrastructure for the PG final year students of M. Sc Medical Lab Technology to do their project work.
- A total of 1158 Medical Certificates of those students who have availed medical leave are authenticated by the Medical Officer.
- A total of 325 NCC students fitness Certificates of those students who have participated various NCC camp are authenticated by the Medical Officer.

Laboratory Service

Loyola Health Centre has also extended its helping hand doing different laboratory tests for the screening and diagnosis of Anemia, Malaria, Typhoid, Diabetes Mellitus, Systemic Hypertension and Coronary Atherosclerotic Heart Disease. A total of 785 students have availed the facilities.

- Special and free health care for the Diabetics through clinical screening and assessing pre and post- prandial blood sugar.
- Free medical & clinical assistance to students and staff and maintenance of medical history of the patients.

The students who have enrolled for AURA club from various departments from both Shift-1 and Shift-2 participated in the function.

AURA CLUB SESSIONS

Regular weekly sessions were conducted for the members of the AURA Club and information was disseminated on various topics:

Topic 1: WHO AM I?

A journey into the inner self helps the students understand themselves. Before reaching out to others, they are helped to know who they are first.

Topic 2: INTRODUCTION TO EMOTIONS

Emotions are within us for a purpose. To help students become aware of the various emotions that they experience and how to enrich one's life by making the best use of them.

Topic 3: HANDLING EMOTIONS EFFECTIVELY

When emotions are not recognized and mishandled we may lose our harmony within and with others. In this session, the students are taught with skills and techniques to handle emotions in an effective way.



Topic 4: FOCUS ON YOUR STRENGTHS

While everyone has their own share of weakness, positive psychology teaches that focusing more on positives, assets or in other words strengths first transforms a person and gives him additional power to work on his liabilities. How this can be made possible is taught to the students this session. An assignment to help them to realize their strengths was given as a follow up measure.

Topic 5: FAMILY ROLES

No man is an island. No one is bereft of a family. We are all connected to each other. But then we take different roles within our biological families or within the close bonds we have grown up with. How have we taken those roles? Of our own free will, or were they forced upon us? If we had taken them, did we consciously or unconsciously? An insight...

Topic 6: NANNIE

This is an acronym for the skills involved in a helping profession. Knowing this primes the students on the essentials required to become a peer guide.

Topic 7: LOVE LANGUAGES

We all have had our own love languages but may not have known distinctly what they are. This is an exploratory session for students to understand their primary love language and also about those of others within their family and friends circle.

Topic 8: ERPR

This is an abbreviation for the four primary responses that are used by a helper. The students are given various examples on how to use their responses effectively. Demo sessions are conducted and students are made to role play in their dyads.

Topic 9: REFLECTIVE LISTENING

This is a continuation of the previous session where students are taught to avoid giving vague messages even in their everyday life but to be clear, concise while they express their feelings. This helps them to become natural helpers and better communicators.

Topic 10: SUBSTANCE ABUSE

A full day session is organized where professionals from the field on substance abuse address the students on the various aspects of substance abuse and how they can help those around them.

Web Enhancement and Public Relations Office (WEPRO)

Regular Updating

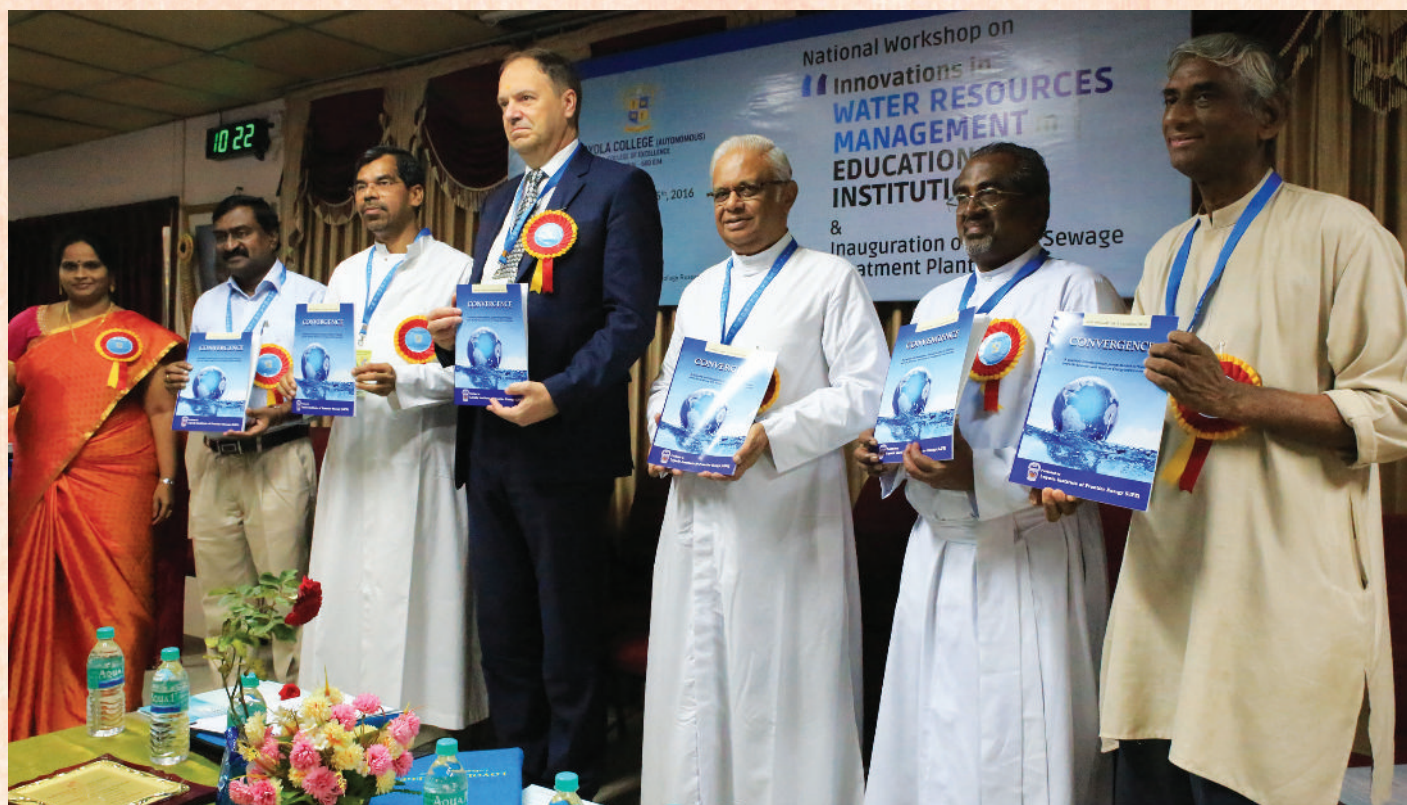

SERVICE LEARNING (OUTREACH)

INTRODUCTION

The Department of Service Learning (formerly called Outreach) was introduced in Loyola College during the academic year 2001-2002, with a view to make the students experience and express concern for the society, especially the disadvantaged sections. The idea of this extension programme is to make Loyola College students to commit themselves to create a better nation by getting involved in the neighbourhood community. With this spirit, the Service Learning unit

works in 41 slums (urban villages or sub-standard settlements) around the college campus. The department has been collaborating with Chennai Corporation, slum clearance board, the corporation schools and like-minded NGOs and institutions in the neighbourhood ever since its inception. To make the initiative a reality, the second year undergraduate students from all departments of both Shift I and II, numbering to about 1850 students are involved in various activities. The activities are streamlined and focused on General Health, Children, Youth, Women and Elders, and other concerns of our times.

AREAS ADOPTED

The neighbourhood areas covered under this project are the revised zones of 8 and 9 in the Corporation of Chennai. This includes slums in and around Choolaimedu, Nungambakkam, Chetpet and Kodambakkam areas. Totally we are involved in 41 slums for community service.



SUMMER CAMP

The Department Service Learning (Outreach) conducted Summer Camp from 27th April to 2nd May, 2016 for the students who were from the outreach working areas. This summer camp concentrated on the career options that students could choose to pursue their higher education. Students were enlightened about the various courses of Arts, Science, Mediation, Engineering, Law and Commerce and Management. This provided an idea for the students to choose the right course according to their choice and willingness. As a result, 24 students were admitted in to Loyola College.

SEMINAR ON VOICE OF SLUMS IN POST FLOOD CHENNAI: FUTURE CONCERNS

The idea of the seminar emerged from the experiences of the last year nonstop rains in Chennai city, December 2015. Hundreds of houses collapsed or submerged in landslides and mudslides. The rain disrupted the normal life of Chennai City people. Tamil Nadu Government, Non-Governmental organizations, Educational Institutions, Corporate and helping minded volunteers jumped into rescue and relief actions and admirably addressed the issues of hunger, shelter, clean drinking water and health and hygiene. Loyola experienced the generosity of people from every quarter in Chennai during the floods. Loyola students involved in the development and educational activities in the slums and people frequently informed of their troubles. The seminar brought out the voice of slum people and enlightened the participants about the Government rehabilitation work and preventive measure for addressing the flood. The voice of slums in post flood Chennai was conducted on 24th October, 2016 at Lawrence Sundaram Auditorium. More than hundred people participated from forty-one working areas by the Department of Service Learning (Outreach). The program started off with a prayer song, and sung by postgraduate students and followed by the welcome address from Fr. Henry Jerome SJ, who welcomed Rev. Fr. Principal, Professors, Community People, NGOs, and Students for the event.

The principal shared his views on the flood-affected times in Chennai and his own experience during the 2004 Tsunami.

CONCLUSION:

The whole event was summarized by Prof. Anand. He highlighted the main points and presented before the community people. Fr. Henry Jerome, addressed the gathering.

Common programs in the college

OUTREACH ADMITTED STUDENTS' PARENTS MEET

Every year Loyola admits a good number of students from the slums. The students who were admitted are closely followed by the faculty of Outreach. In this connection, a Parents' meeting was organized.



Parents' meeting was held on the 3rd of August 2016, at MRF hall, Loyola College. There were about 40 participants in the parents' meeting to thank Fr. Principal and Fr. Director. Prof. Rathna sang the prayer song, followed by Prof. Baskar Jayabalan welcomed the gathering. Chief guests were Dr. Arokiasamy Xavier SJ, Principal, Loyola College and Fr. Henry Jerome, Director of Service Learning (Outreach).

BAG TO SCHOOL MOVEMENT

Department of Service Learning in collaboration with Brotherhood mission, an organization working among the poor organized the event called Bag to School movement in Bertram hall on 28th September 2016. The primary objective of the program is to motivate the children studying in Chennai High Schools which are run by Chennai Corporation.

YOUTH DAY CELEBRATIONS

The Department of service learning (Outreach) had organized a programme for the youth representing the 41 slums chosen for Outreach intervention at L S hall on 12th January, 2017.

Rev. Fr. Secretary, addressed the students and made them aware of their responsibilities. The main objective of youth day celebrations was to present the opportunities available for the youth and to encourage them to engage purposefully in their future endeavours. Mr. Marana GanaViji was invited as the chief guest for the Programme and he spoke about the struggles faced by him through his career.

A MOTIVATION PROGRAMME FOR THE SLUM 10TH AND 12TH STANDARD SCHOOL-GOING STUDENTS

On 19th February, 2017 the Department of Service Learning (Outreach) organized a motivation programme for IX and XII students from the slums. Rev. Fr. Henry Jerome, Director spoke about the dimension of the programme and he was sharing his thoughts about his school days. He was stressing on the point that Chennai will only be developed if the students from underdeveloped areas get good education.

ELDERS PROGRAM

On February 22, 2017, Department of Service Learning organised a programme for Elders' from many areas in and around Chennai. The students of Loyola College helped organize this event by taking initiative to bring the respective elders to the college.

1. PROGRAMS FOR WOMEN

The women empowerment team had good rapport with women in 41 slums. The main activity of this team is based on bringing social and economic empowerment of the women in slums. In view of empowerment process, students organised input sessions in 41 slums on women's rights and Government welfare schemes and policy guidelines, domestic violence, health issues and skill oriented programmes for women in slums.

2. PROGRAMS FOR ELDERS AND DIFFERENTLY ABLED

On the eve of World Elders' Day, the students celebrated elders' day in twenty slums and blankets were distributed to the elders. Several general health camps were organised for the elders.

3. HEALTH PROMOTION PROGRAMS

The students belonging to the health and sanitation teams have networked with local primary health centres and hospitals to organise free health check-up. The students conducted twenty five eye camps to identify the cataract problem with the help of Sankar Nethralaya Hospital.

LOYOLA STUDENTS SUPPORT SERVICES



INTRODUCTION

The second year journey of Loyola Students Support Services (LSSS) is a successful one. LSSS has spread its objective and vision to the entire student community. LSSS provides financial, Academic, medical and personal support to the students, particularly from our target groups namely Orphans, Semi Orphans, Dalit poor, Sri Lankan Refugees and the Rural Poor students. It encompasses counseling, mentoring, tuitions, and host activities that would provide platforms for self-articulation and for enhancement on self-esteem.

1. LSSS helped in the admission process by identifying the Orphan and Semi-orphan students irrespective of caste and religion, poor and Dalit Catholics, economically poor and vulnerable students, Academically Weaker, Physically and Visually Challenged, Refugees, Gypsy and Foreign students who have come to Loyola on academic exchanges and service learning.
2. LSSS conducted orientation programme for all Dalit and Poor students coming from the Tamil medium sections. Thus organized Special English Coaching Classes. This year tutors are hired from the trained institution like MAGNUM OPUS.

SPECIAL ENGLISH COACHING CLASSES

3. Enabling Club Programme: LSSS has put its best effort on the academically weaker students who have got more arrears in collaboration with the respective department and through the idea of Peer Learning.
4. Midday Meals Scheme: Nearly 410 deserving and poor students are benefitting from midday meals scheme.
5. Management Fee Concession & Other Concession: Nearly Rs.1.88crores(Shift I – Rs. 67, 12,570/- and Shift II – Rs.



1, 20,38,040/-) was given to the deserving and the Poor students as Management Concession in their semester fees. All the Orphan and Semi orphan students were assisted through concessions in their semester fees after personal verification of their family conditions.

6. Government Scholarship: Nearly 81lacs were given as Government scholarships so far.
7. Other Scholarships: This year we have received scholarships from various Corporate and Educational trust such as Sumitomo Corporation Delhi, Oil and Natural Gas Corporation Limited (ONGC), Sri. Bhakthavatchalam trust and Association to the tune of Rs. 12.7 lacs. LSSS received sum of Rs. 6.5 lacs from Oil and Natural Gas Corporation Limited (ONGC) for 100 SC/ST students through CSR programme
8. Part Time Jobs: All part time jobs in the college are brought under LSSS. The preference is given to Orphan, Semi Orphan and economically poor.
9. Art and Literary: Art and Literary is a unit of LSSS to learn traditional folk media and subaltern culture. Nearly 180 students enrolled in this unit. Every Wednesday our unit conducts special study circle and guest lecture programme and also every Saturday we conduct print, folk and electronic media workshops for these students.
10. Veethi Viruthu Vizha: Loyola Students Support Services (LSSS) together with Alternative Media Centre organized an enthralling state level Folk Arts performance 'VEEDHI VIRUDHU VIZHA' for the 4th consecutive year on 7th & 8th Jan, 2017 at Loyola College. There were around 1150 artistes of 50 groups from 32 districts of Tamil Nadu.

FOLK ARTS PERFORMANCE COMPETITION

There was a competition among all the folk arts group that were present for the Veedhi Virudu Vizha and the best performing first three groups were awarded with cash prize worth Rs.30,000. The second day program commenced with the grand rally took out on 8thJan, 2017 by more than 1150 artists of Tamil Nadu from ValluvarKottam to Loyola College. The rally decorated the streets of Chennai with folk music and dance of the whole of Tamil Nadu and set a festivemood in the Capital

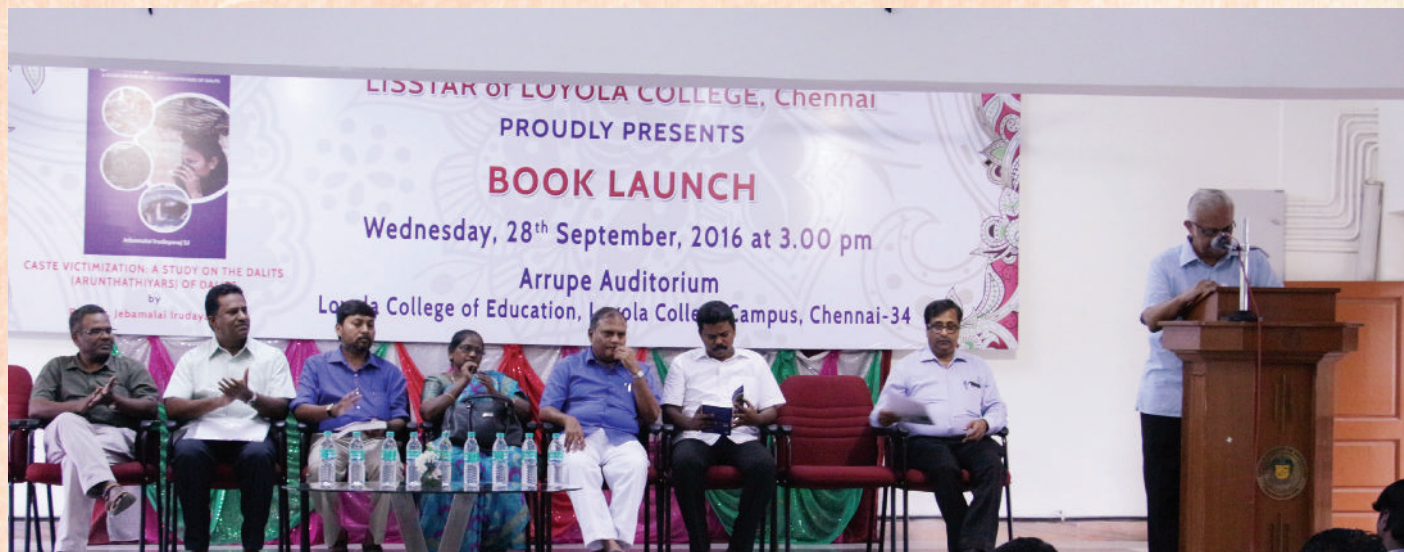
