YEP JAPAN (SEA TRAINING)

Out of the 3 cadets from our country, a Loyola college was selected to represent our country as the youth ambassador of India to JAPAN, VIETNAM, PHILLIPPINES, SINGAPORE, MALAYASIA AND INDONESIA. He also visited the Andaman Islands during the period of his foreign delegation. During the sea training he got the opportunity of flying over the Andaman Islands in the Donear & IL 808 pf Indian aircraft that has flown over Tokyo in Japan for fighter flights. He also took part in the Japan fleet review in the presence of Japan Prime Minister. He got the chance to fire HMG, LMG, Rocket launchers, AK 47 & this delegation was over a period of 73 days.
