## **WORKSHOP ON 'MEMORY STUDIES'**

According to him, the memory of past events as we know today also reflect the power structure of the past and one should question why we remember or are taught a particular event in a particular way. Literature students in this sense should also try to decode implicit collective memory because it would help them to gain a holistic understanding of any event or text.
