The famous visual artist instilled curiosity in students through conversation. His phenomenal work in the field of line drawing, animation, storyboarding, and computer graphics is undoubtedly a fine repository. His take on animation and its vital role in pop culture gave many insights and interesting trivia on the finest filmmakers, being an artist, whose works have in some way or the other was influenced by art and painting. The evolution of comics across the globe and Japanese manga and anime being the prime ones that are consumed is a remarkable achievement by artists and illustrators. Liberty in the art form is expressive which can ideate revolution and create history. He cited Salvador Dali, and Leonardo da Vinci as his mentors and learned a lot from them.



Marudu's role as a VFX, and supervisor, in major films and international projects, shows an undulating area of expertise and is undoubtedly a hub to ponder. When asked about the importance of storyboarding, he said, "*It's like a must-have guide for every creator*."
