

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#### ABOUT THE EVENT

Quantitative Aptitude, being the mainstay of every competitive exam, has become vital that every student must strengthen his/her aptitude skills today. A program was conducted to educate the students of Commerce Department and the members of the MBA Rank Gainer Club, on the nuances of applying strategies and tactics, so that they can have an edge over quantitative aptitude. For this purpose, Mr. Jenin Benitto (Lead Mentor of IMS Chennai) was invited as the resource person.

The program began with a short prayer by Caleb Samuel (2<sup>nd</sup> Year B. Com student) followed by a welcome address by Godric Jeswin Paiva. Then, Prof. Charles Jail Singh an overview of the programme by emphasizing the significance of developing quantitative aptitude. Arun and B. N. Mathi (2<sup>nd</sup> Year B. Com students) introduced the resource persons Mr. Jenin Benitto and Mr. Syed Saleem (Zonal Head of IMS Chennai). After the introductory speech, Dr M. Sivakumar and Prof. Charles Jail Singh felicitated the resource persons.

Then, Mr. Jenin Benitto briefed about what aptitude is and why aptitude is necessary using some probing questions on aptitude and also explained how to solve them. One striking question asked during the program was - "A man sells his typewriter at a loss of 5%. If he sells it for Rs.80 more, he gains 5%. What is the cost price of typewriter?". He explained how to derive the answer in a simple manner. A short Q&A session was also conducted after the lecture in which the students clarified their doubts. The program ended with a vote of thanks proposed by Mr. Sripathy Siva (2<sup>nd</sup> Year B.Com. Student).

Finally, the feedback from the students was received during the session. Om Prakash, student from Mathematics Department, gave his feedback on how the program had changed his thoughts on aptitude. Few others also stated that they were encouraged to interact with the resource person and the interactions gained them adequate insights on the approachability towards Quantitative Aptitude. Furthermore, many students felt happy that



their doubts related to quantitative aptitude were clearly addressed. A few students also learned the procedures to apply for various programs in B-Schools. Almost all the students felt that the resource person was highly knowledgeable and proficient in the field of aptitude. Overall, it was an engaging and an enriching seminar.
