REPORT ON STUDENT-ALUMNI INTERACTION EVENT 5TH AUGUST, 2022

About the Event:

The department initiated the student-alumni interaction for all the 1st year B. Com students in order to sensitize students on the Transformation that college education will bring in them. Two alumni of the 2019 batch Mr Bhavesh Kuma, Mr Chiranjeevi and Mr Deepak were invited to address the 1st year B. Com students that took place in CEF 12 (School of Commerce & Economics Building – 1st Floor).

Mr. Bhavesh, an alumnus passed out from Loyola during 2021-2022, cleared his CA (Inter) during the first two years of his under graduation and completed CFA group II exam during his third year. He shared students about his academic journey during his three years of education in the institution. He stressed the importance of discipline and attendance in college. He advised the students to participate in the cultural and sports events and other events organized by the college and choose activity clubs as per their interests. He inspired the students to bring out their hidden talents and let their friends or professors know so that they can provide with the required opportunities to exhibit the same.
