Full papers should range between 3,000 and 4,000 words (excluding references) and be typed in Times New Roman, 12-point font, with 1.5 line spacing. Submissions should strictly adhere to the MLA 9th Edition. The first page of the paper should contain the title, author's details, and abstract. All submissions must be original, unpublished, and free from plagiarism. Papers should be submitted in Microsoft Word format (.doc/.docx) to wgsdg2026@loyolacollege.edu on or before January 31, 2026.

All submissions will undergo a review process to ensure academic quality and relevance to the conference theme. Only selected papers will be considered for publication.
