
A Virtual Talk on The Enduring Relevance of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr

Mr. Moulik also compared Martin Luther King with Mahatma Gandhi and explained the influence of Gandhian principles in Luther King's life. Mr. Moulik engaged in an intense discussion session with the participants to reiterate how the bilateral relationship between USA and India still continues.
