7. a) Analyse similarities and differences between Nansen's pioneering approaches vs. current refugee policies and coordination efforts based on the 2023 Global Refugee Forum.

b) Examine the various waves of Sri Lankan refugee influx into India, delineating the socio-political contexts and driving factors behind each wave. Evaluate the challenges and concerns associated with the livelihood, integration, repatriation, and rehabilitation of Sri Lankan refugees in India.
8. a) Evaluate the designation of Tibetan refugees as 'privileged refugees,' and assess the socio-economic and political conditions of Tibetan refugees in India, with an analysis of India's Tibetan refugee policy, with a specific focus on the Tibetan Rehabilitation Policy of 2014.

- b) Discuss the contributing factors, living conditions, and policy challenges surrounding any two significant stateless communities in South Asia.
9. a) Define the concept of a migrant, considering various definitions and classifications used in migration studies and elucidate the "push-pull factors" framework of migration.

- b) Why have ratification rates of the UN Migrant Workers Convention (1990) been declining across all nations, especially among key destination countries for migrants? Discuss the barriers that have kept important nations from signing or ratifying this convention's pledges to protect migrant workers' fundamental rights along with the rights of their families.
