The programme commenced with a Welcome Address by Ms. Bavadharni S, II PG, followed by the Chief Guest Introduction delivered by Ms. P. Amanda, PG Department Secretary.

Chief Guest Address

The festival was inaugurated by Dr. Radhika Murugesan, Consultant Psychiatrist and Founder and CEO of Chennai Minds. In her insightful inaugural address, she emphasized the fundamental differences between the human brain and artificial intelligence and shed light on key mental health concerns such as neurodivergence and the rising prevalence of mental illnesses including anxiety and depression. She also discussed factors contributing to women's mental health vulnerabilities, double burden of work, childcare responsibilities, socio-economic challenges, patriarchal structures and struggles with personal identity. She encouraged students to cultivate self-awareness, communicate openly and understand their emotional wellbeing.

Participants from M.O.P. Vaishnav College, Stella Maris College, Women's Christian College, Ethiraj College for Women, B.S. The valedictory address and felicitation were delivered by Dr. J. Vanitha, Head of the Department of Sociology, who commended the participants for their active involvement and the department for successfully hosting the event.
