INVITED LECTURE FOR BA STUDENTS






CONCLUSION

A REPORT ON INVITED LECTURE- BA SOCIOLOGY STUDENTS

On July 19th 2023, an invited lecture was organized by the Department of Sociology at Loyola College for the second and third-year BA Sociology students. Mr. Raja, an alumnus and a former faculty of the Sociology department was the guest speaker. The guest speaker was introduced by Dr. Gautam Manoharan. Mr. Raja had recently cleared the CAPF (Central Armed Police Forces) exam conducted by the UPSC (Union Public Service Commission).





Mr. Raja, after his Bachelors in Sociology at Loyola (2011-14), did his Masters in Sociology at Jawaharlal Nehru University (2014-16), Delhi. He had been preparing for the Civil service exams since his days in JNU. He had appeared

for the UPSC exams four times and for the CAPF exam two times. He had also appeared for the Lok Sabha Secretariat exam and IBPS PO (Institute of Banking Personnel Selection Probationary Officers Recruitment exam) and RRB (Railway Recruitment Board) exam. He shared his experience on all these exams. He advised students to focus on the Aptitude part of the exam which is the CSAT. Many do not focus on CSAT because it is just a qualifying paper and Mr. Raja had also done the same mistake. He also mentioned that Aptitude may also help for other Competitive exams as well. Mr. Raja also mentioned that he had an alternate career option as he had cleared his NET. He also advised the students to have an alternative career option for a secured future. Only after the thought of alternate career Mr. Raja gave his try on the Lok Sabha Secretariat exam, IBPS PO exam and the RRB exam. Students were also enthusiastically participating in the program and were asking questions to the guest speaker. Some of the questions were whether he went to any Coaching Institute, what were the steps to join JNU, and students also wanted him to elaborate on the Lok Sabha Secretariat job and the CAPF exam. The guest speaker answered to all the questions patiently. Regarding the Coaching Institute he said that he had joined one during his final year in Masters. And regarding the JNU entrance he mentioned that during his days there were no CUET instead JNU had its own Entrance exam. And that exam is descriptive unlike the CUET which is objective. And he also mentioned that the recruitment for Lok Sabha Secretariat is not conducted periodically instead the call comes only if there is any vacancy. Regarding the CAPF exam he mentioned that the science syllabus was very vast and deep which made Mr. Raja prepare Physics, Chemistry and Biology like an IIT Aspirant. He also mentioned about the physical requirements needed for the CAPF. The physical test for CAPF included two phases. The first phase is Static where the measurement of chest expanded and unexpanded is taken. And the second phase is dynamic and involved four events. The four events include 100and 800-meter running, long jump and shot put. After sharing his experience students were amazed and motivated by his patience and perseverance, he had all these years for getting the job he loved. Because Mr. Raja has been preparing for the exam for nearly eight years. Students felt the session was really informative and motivating them for their Civil service examination
